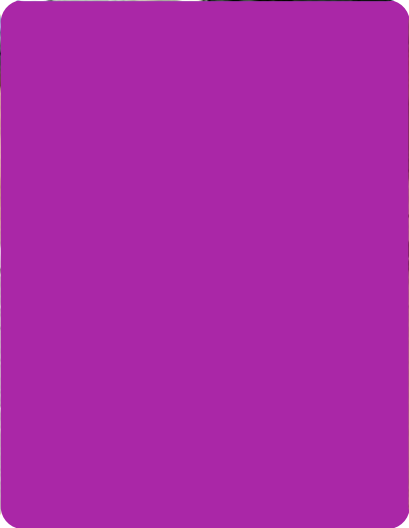
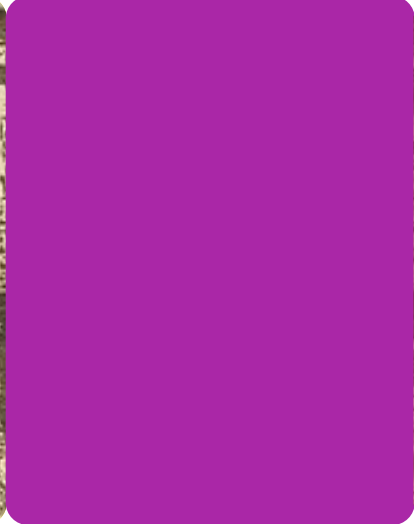
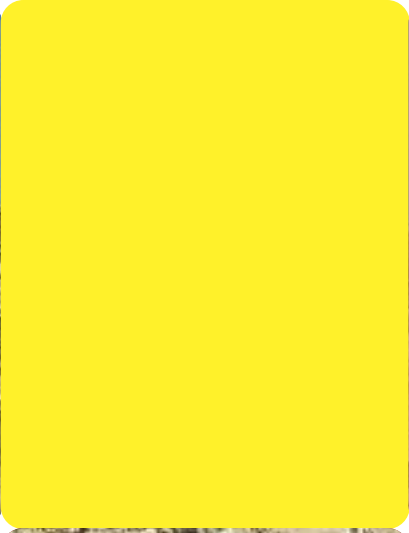

Academic Support

T&E provides support to students before, during, and after their study abroad program.

Our advisors can help prospective students find the program that best fits their academic needs and goals.

While abroad, students enjoy the help and guidance of T&E's on-site resident staff members, all of whom hold advanced degrees.

After the end of the program, students may contact T&E with questions about transferred credits, insurance claims, additional transcript requests, and alumni relations.

Accredited Foreign Universities

The Universities of Castile and Leon have been recognized nationally and internationally for their excellence in teaching and research. Furthermore, these institutions have a proven commitment to receiving international students and incorporating them into the mainstream of their courses. T&E and the Universities of Castile and Leon work in partnership to ensure the best educational opportunities for all of their students.

Transfer Credit

At the time of application, T&E asks that all students receive academic approval from an advisor at their home institution. We advise students of the importance of meeting their institution's internal requirements for studying abroad and of receiving pre-ap-

proval for the classes they plan to take while in a T&E program.

Upon the successful completion of a T&E program, we will issue an official transcript which lists all coursework. T&E will send the university and T&E center transcript to the appropriate office at the student's home institution in the U.S., along with a cover letter that translates the transcript and provides a suggested grade conversion scale.

Housing

Our students typically live with host families, but some students prefer to live in residence halls or student apartments. Living with a family or in a residence hall includes three meals per day and laundry service once a week for the length of the program. Ironing is not included.

Homestay

Staying with a host family is an ideal way to enrich the experience and to reinforce the knowledge gained during the program. Students will really make the most of their stay by being in direct contact with the local culture; this will be accomplished as they gradually get to know an authentic Spanish way of life.

We have known many of the families for years, and we can assure you that all have extensive experience in providing accommodations for international students. They have been selected according to their level of culture and for the personal attention that they provide to our students. The majority of our families are composed of a father, a mother, and children, although some families consist of simply a mother and her children, as in other cultures. They may also take in Spanish students during the academic year (October to June) and even several international students. We make sure that the number of students is appropriate for the type of housing and that there is a mix of different nationalities. This ensures that all communication will be in Spanish, which, of course, is the official language within the family.

On arrival, the students will be given a key so they can come and go as they please and no independence is lost. The students will also be able to receive telephone calls.

Residence Halls

During the academic year, the residence halls are occupied mainly by Spanish students, but in the summer months (July, August, and September) they are used almost exclusively by international students. They have spacious rooms, shared bathrooms, and communal areas with television, video and music systems. Laundry service is also available.

NOTE: Space is limited during the month of June and requests for residence halls will be granted on a first come first serve basis therefore early registration is highly recommended.

Medical Insurance

A general medical and accident insurance policy is provided as part of the quoted program fees for the duration of the program while the participant is on Spanish soil. We also provide an additional comprehensive mandatory insurance policy which covers the following for an additional fee for which the participant will be billed separately:



- Accidental death and dismemberment
- Medical expenses
- Repatriation of remains
- Emergency medical evacuation
- Trip cancellation and interruption

Extensions for medical coverage can be made for an additional fee if students plan to be abroad before or after the program period. Prior to arrival, students must submit their medical history to T&E so that our staff can be prepared to accommodate any health concerns. T&E's resident staff is equipped to help students receive quality medical care in the event of illness or injury, and all personal medical history will be kept confidential.

The health and personal safety of our students is of the utmost importance to T&E. Prior to the start of the program, students receive an orientation handbook which contains safety information pertinent to Spain, as well as tips for integration into the local culture. Once in Spain, our resident staff conducts an orientation to welcome students to Spain and to discuss certain cultural expectations, safety concerns, and guidelines for daily living in Spain.

The resident staff is also in close contact with the U.S. Embassy in Spain and is ready to respond to any relevant situations that might arise. T&E also closely follows the guidelines of the U.S. State Department and will aid students returning to the US in case of a crisis.

Finally, T&E's resident staff is available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, to help any student in the event of an emergency while abroad. T&E will provide students with the necessary telephone numbers prior to departure as well as during on-site orientation sessions.

Social and Cultural Activities

These activities invite students to experience the local color of Spain and to enhance their education. The T&E staff develops unique cultural activities in order to maximize cultural immersion.

Homestays with local families, excursions to sites of historical, cultural, and ecological interest, conversation sessions with Spanish students, program orientations, tastings of regional cuisine, and various other social and cultural activities such as lectures on art, history and culture, showing of famous films, dance lessons, sports, visits to city monuments, swimming, and horseback riding (minimum participation required for select activities). All work to reinforce the material that the students learn through a broad range of classes across multiple academic disciplines.

Excursions

Ground transportation, entrance fees, and guided tours are included on all T&E excursions. Hotel accommodations and breakfast are included on all overnight excursions. As part of T&E's general excursion offer students can visit the cities of Toledo, Segovia, Avila, and Madrid depending on the length of their stay. T&E also offers excursions to Leon, Sierra de Francia, Zamora, Valladolid... that will run given a minimum student participation. T&E's Philadelphia office can help pre-plan your trip should you decide to travel anywhere in (Barcelona, Sevilla, Valencia) or outside Spain

On-site staff and office

T&E's full-time resident staff members assist students with all aspects of their experience abroad. They provide support during official course registration and arrange the program orientation, the social and cultural activities, and much more.

They are rigorously trained to ensure the well-being of each program participant and are dedicated to facilitating a positive and meaningful study abroad experience.

They also provide students with tutoring at no additional cost and conversation sessions with Spanish students. This service is arranged by the on-site Director.

The T&E staff is available to its participants 24 hours a day.

At the T&E on-site office, students have free access to computers, Internet, a laboratory equipped with academic and multimedia resources, and a library where they can study and use our collection of specialized Spanish books and dictionaries. Books may also be borrowed during the week.

The students may receive calls and faxes for free.

The office offers students a sense of security while abroad, while serving as a common meeting place and resource center.

Student card with shopping discounts

The students can get discounts in bookshops, gymnasiums, restaurants, hairdressers and other shops with the T&E Student Card. Students enrolled in university programs will also receive official university IDs from the chosen host institution.

Cell Phone

T&E will provide the student with a European cell phone with available services from a reliable local provider. Students will be provided information about the use of cell phone in the Orientation Packet as well as in the on-site orientation session. The provided phone will have an initial courtesy credit however, once that is depleted, individual participants will be responsible for additional costs associated with usage.

Passport and Visa Requirements

T&E students have the responsibility of obtaining a valid passport. In addition, when applying for a visa, your passport should be valid for an additional six months from the last day of your program.

With regards to visas, because the application procedure can take up to 2 months, participants need to make sure they allow ample time for completion and processing of the visa application.

UNIVERSITY OF SALAMANCA

Salamanca is considered one of the most spectacular Renaissance cities in Europe. Walking through the streets of this city will give the impression of strolling through time in a living museum of unimaginable historical wealth. Salamanca offers the conveniences of a larger city with the intimacy and quaintness associated with small European towns. Of its 160,000 population, the natives are said to speak the “purest” Spanish in all of Spain which contributes to the allure of this destination and makes it among the most popular for students of Spanish language and culture. The University of Salamanca is located just blocks from T&E’s Salamanca offices which serve as information and activity hubs for T&E students. Our offices offer extended hours for academic and recreational use. The amenities include free unlimited internet use for research and communications, a library, and a full staff of professionals to help with any needs you may have. Our offices also offer organized activities such as sports, films, dance, games and social functions where you can interact with international students from all over the globe.

The University of Salamanca was founded as a "General School of the kingdom" by the Leonese king Alfonso IX in 1218 to allow the Leonese people to stay and study at home without having to leave for Castile. During the 15th and 16th centuries, this university took part in the new humanist trends, and thanks to Nebrija’s teaching in Salamanca it became quite a popular studying location. The prestige of Salamanca brought students from all over the Peninsula to its university, and even Europeans and Spanish Americans. Nowadays, the University of Salamanca has more than 2,000 teachers and 38,000 students of which approximately 4,000 are foreign students coming from all over the world. Its great relationship with foreign universities, further institutions, private and public companies is very significant.

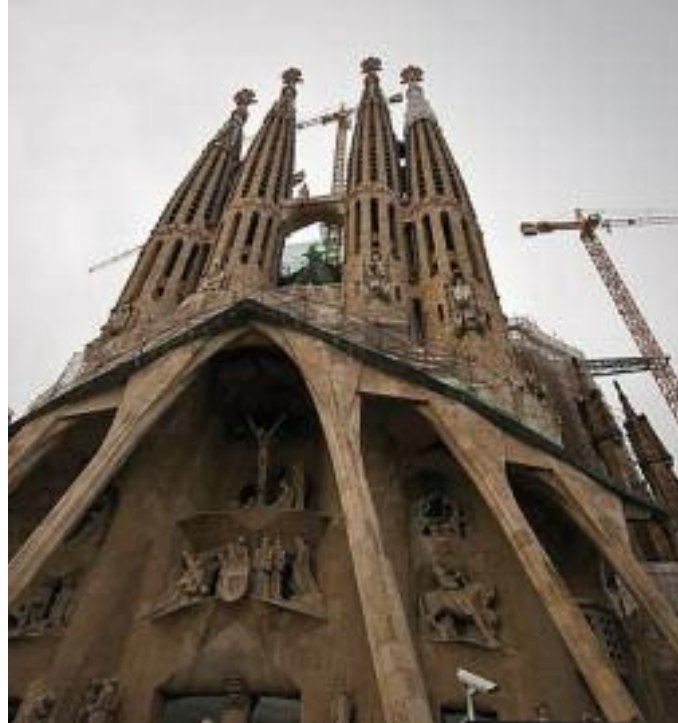
BABYLON BARCELONA

Barcelona is one of the most popular destinations to learn Spanish in the world, and students can enjoy its cosmopolitan flair, architecture, beaches, rich history, beaches, and night life. The city has about 1.5 million inhabitants, and the metropolitan area contains about 4 million. A trading city, Barcelona grew to become one of the dominant cities in the western Mediterranean in the 11th century. However, due to its allegiance to France prior to being won by Spain, Barcelona was not permitted to trade with the Americas, thus being denied a significant source of wealth. These resources allowed the arts and architecture to flourish in the region, lending to the beauty that can be witnessed today. Catalonia is officially bilingual, but Spanish is the dominant language, which means that students will be able to practice their language skills with no trouble.

The language academy is located in the city center in one of the historic buildings and includes fully equipped classrooms, a communal living room to relax or meet up with other students, and a large outdoor terrace. 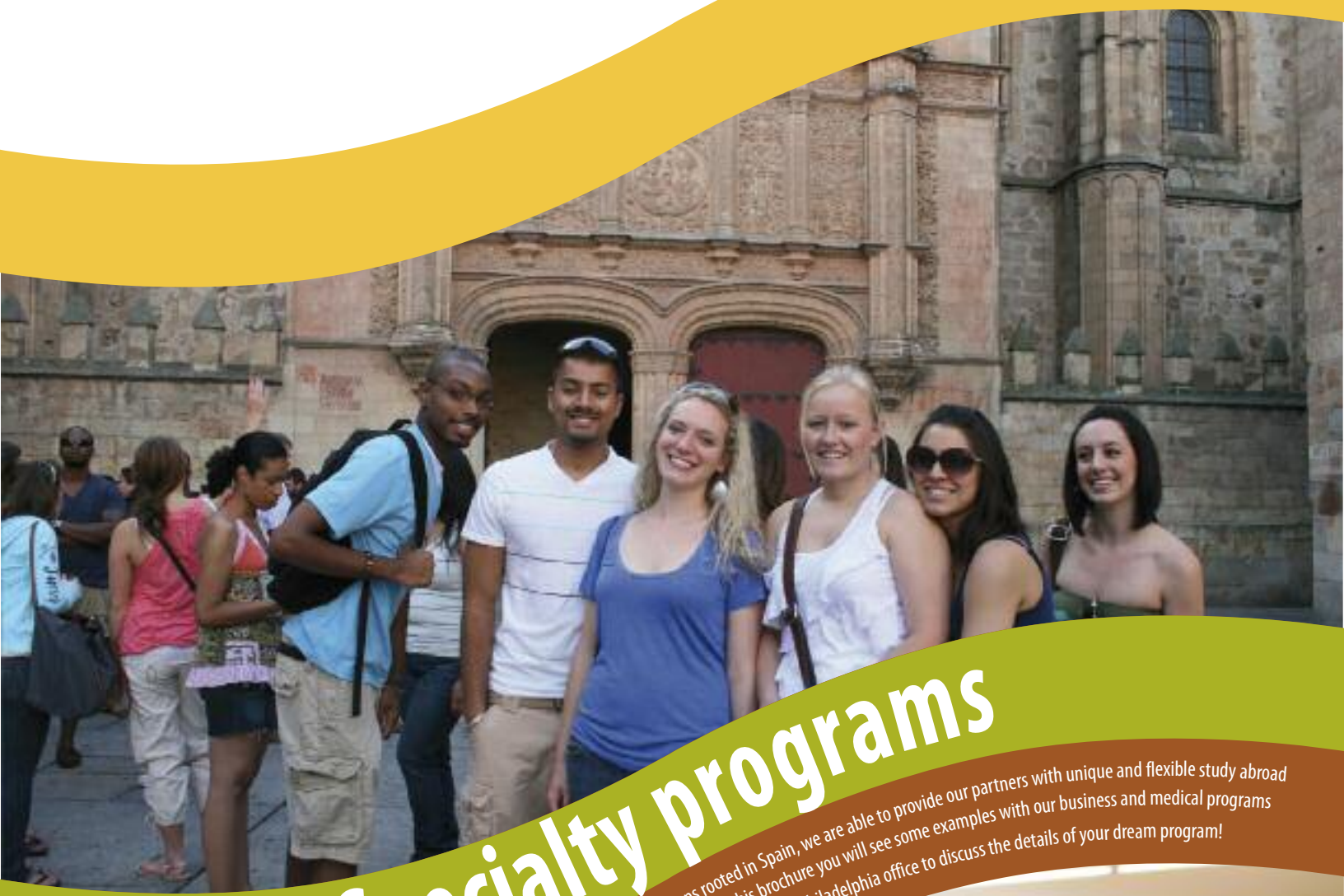

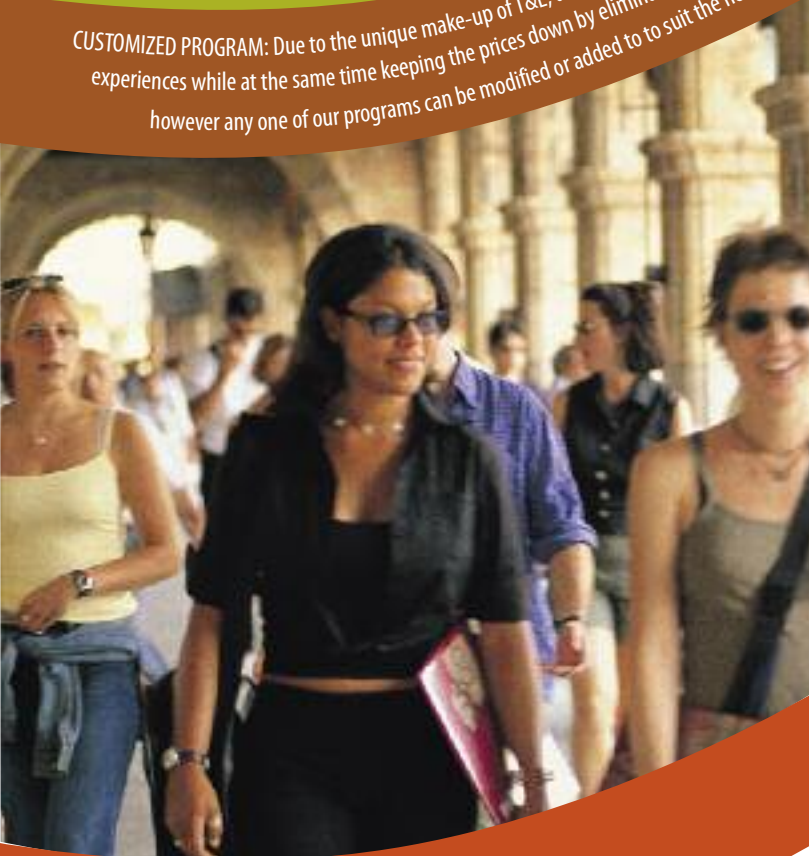

IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR SEMESTER PARTICIPANTS

Obtaining T&E documentation for student visas (procedure and checklist)

If you will be staying in Spain for more than 90 calendar days you will be required to obtain a student visa. Generally the fall semester falls short however if you plan to extend your stay or are studying during the spring semester you will need to obtain a visa in order to take part in our semester programs.

Although T&E does not get involved directly in this process as it is the sole responsibility of the individual participants, below we offer a checklist to follow in order to obtain the necessary documentation from our organization (these documents are only some of the required documents necessary to obtain your visa. For a complete list you must refer to the embassy website).

- Complete and sign T&E Application/Contract with semester program choice.
- Send in registration fee of \$95 as well as \$495 confirmation payment with your completed application at least 3 months before your program start date.
- Once application is sent, make an appointment with the closest Spanish Embassy to your home city. See following website www.travel.state.gov for details regarding embassy locations and general visa requirements.
- Notify T&E via email at info@travelandeducation.org once you have scheduled an appointment with the date established and the address of your chosen Spanish Embassy site in the US.
- Obtain official acceptance letter from T&E for presentation at your scheduled embassy appointment.
- Obtain official certificate through T&E from your chosen host institution for presentation at your scheduled embassy appointment.
- Obtain proof of comprehensive insurance coverage through T&E from 3rd party provider for presentation at your scheduled embassy appointment.

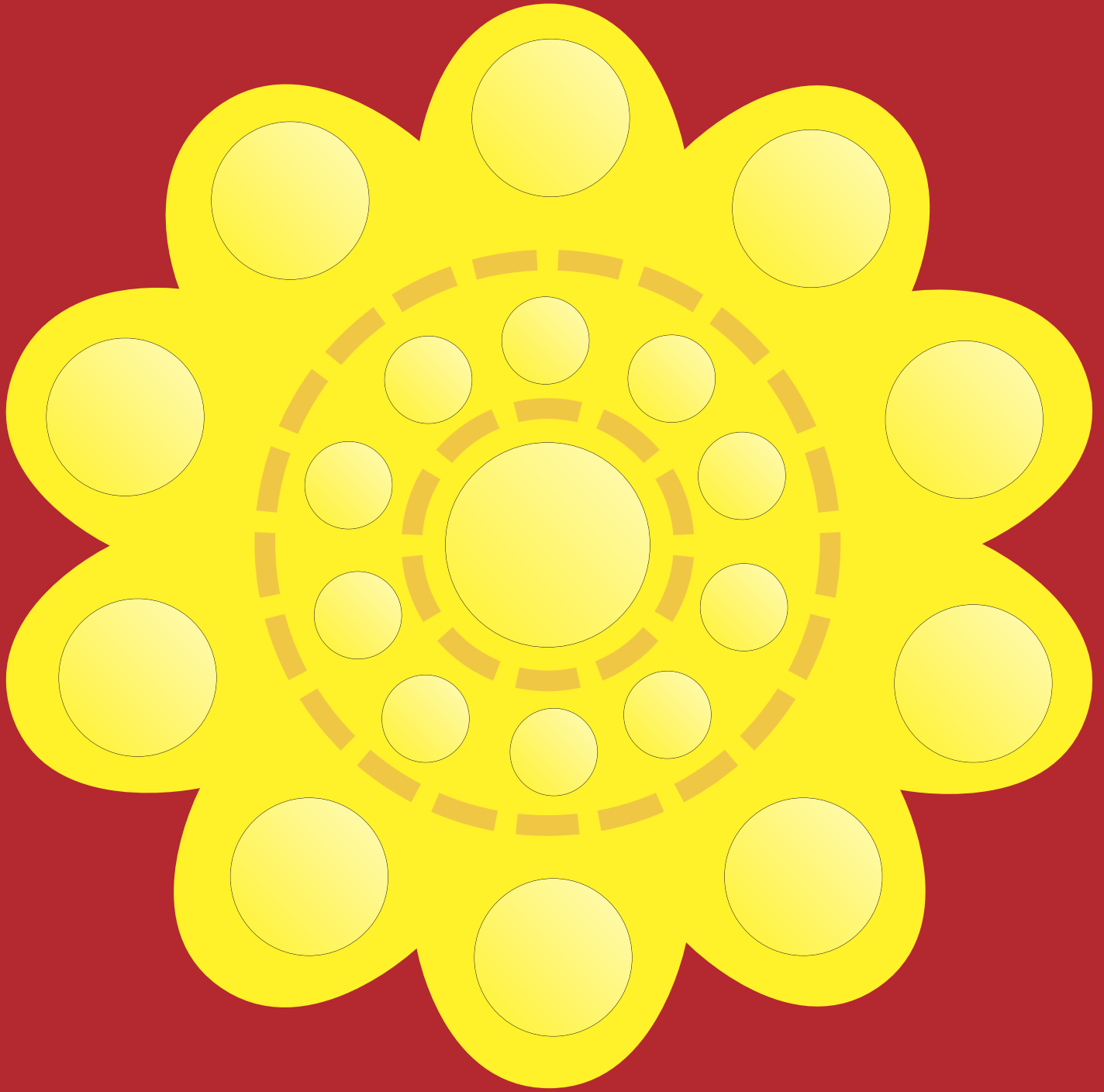
