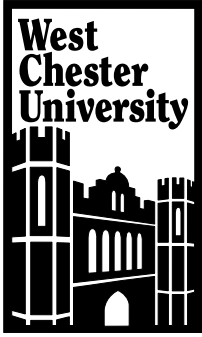

2010 Graduate Summer and Fall Calendar and Registration Information

Scheduling

Graduate students who have been accepted into a program should meet with their adviser, prior to the start of scheduling, to plan their course work for the upcoming session. Beginning Sunday, February 28, 2010, matriculated students currently in a graduate program may schedule online through their myWCU account. Nondegree students who have not been formally accepted into a graduate program may schedule at the Office of Graduate Studies and Extended Education or complete a registration form at www.wcupa.edu/grad (look under **Forms and Policies** for the nondegree registration form) beginning Monday, March 15, 2010. Students should register for classes early in the scheduling period. Class availability toward the end of the scheduling period is limited.

The University/department reserves the right to drop from the class roster any student who schedules for course work without appropriate prerequisites or approvals.

Before You Self-Schedule

1. The summer/fall 2010 graduate course schedule (course offerings) is available online at www.wcupa.edu/grad and on myWCU.
2. You should contact your adviser before scheduling to discuss what course work should be taken.
3. All University bills must be paid in full and all holds must be cleared before you are eligible to schedule (including tuition, housing, meals, bookstore, library, and parking tickets). You may use your myWCU account to check for existing holds.

How to Self-Schedule Using myWCU

MyWCU is the University portal that has access to enrollment, class schedules, grades, personal information, useful links, important announcements, and more.

Accessing Your WCU E-mail Account and myWCU

A student's West Chester University account allows access for the following purposes:

- Student administration system, myWCU, which is used to obtain student information, grading, and class scheduling
- WCU e-mail (webmail)
- Blackboard, which is used by instructors to post course materials, hold online discussions, and give tests, quizzes, and surveys
- Logon to the University network

Before new students can use their WCU account for any of the above services, they must first initialize their password.

To initialize your password, please follow these instructions:

1. In your browser type <http://www.wcupa.edu/>.
 2. Next to the login box, click on the link labeled **Change Password**.
 3. Enter your user name (the initial letters of your first and last names followed by your six-digit WCU ID number). An example of this is BE123456@wcupa.edu.
 4. If you have never logged into the system before, your **Old Password** is WCU-MMDDYY. In your old password, **the WCU is capitalized** and the MMDDYY is your date of birth. An example of this would be January 1, 1984 = WCU-010184.
 5. Enter a new password which is **at least eight characters in length** and includes **at least three of the following requirements**:
 - Lowercase character
 - Uppercase character
 - Numeric character
 - Special character such as # \$ *
- Note:** You may not use any part of your name in your new password.
6. Then type that password again to confirm and click **Change Password/Passphrase**.
 7. For security reasons, you will be prompted to configure the **Self-Service Online Password Reset Tool**. Setting up this tool will enable you to reset your password at anytime. After you have completed setting up your questions and answers, click **Submit**.
 8. Your new password is good for 90 days.

Viewing Your University E-mail from Outside the University

All degree students are assigned an e-mail account. Academic advisers, instructors, and administrative offices will be sending you e-mail to this account address. You can view your e-mail using any Web browser or Internet provider. Here are the steps:

1. From your normal browser, go to <http://webmail.wcupa.edu>. Note: Do not use **www** in front of **webmail**. Click on the **help** button for help in using your webmail account.
2. Enter your account name (your initials plus your student ID).
3. Click on the **login** button.
4. Enter your account name again.
6. Enter your password.
7. Press the **OK** button.

This will put you into the inbox of your e-mail account.

Continuous Registration Reminder

All students who have been admitted to a graduate program must maintain continuous registration each **fall** and **spring** semester. If you are not enrolling in a course, you must request continuous registration. **You are not able to self register for continuous registration.** Contact the Graduate Office at 610-436-2943 to schedule continuous registration; no fees are charged. If you plan not to enroll in course work for more than one semester, you must request a leave of absence. Forms are available at www.wcupa.edu/grad; click on **Forms and Policies**.

Grade reports **will not** be automatically mailed. If you need an official copy of your semester's grades for tuition reimbursement, fill out a request form at www.wcupa.edu/registrar. Please note that you can also print a copy of your grades from myWCU.

How to Request Pennsylvania Act 48 Hours/Credits

Professional educators can now request submission of their Act 48 hours to the Pennsylvania Department of Education directly on the Web.

How It Works

- After completing a class at West Chester University for which you wish to receive Act 48 credit, log on to **Edulink** at <http://www.act48hours.com>.
- Enter the information about the class as directed.
- The WCU Office of the Registrar will verify that the hours and credits were satisfactorily completed.
- WCU will submit the verified hours/credits to the Pennsylvania Department of Education records management site.

What to Do

- Visit www.act48hours.com.
- Click on **Professional Educator**.
- Click on **Register** (if you are a first-time user of this automated system), or click on **Log On** (if you have used the system before).
- Click on **Submission of Credits**.
- Enter the requested information and click **Submit**.

Your request will be sent to West Chester University. After we verify that the hours/credits were completed, we will submit your credits to the Pennsylvania Department of Education records management site.

You may check your Act 48 progress at the Department of Education records management site. Click on **Check Educator's Continuing Education Progress** and enter your Social Security number. The site address is <http://perm.ed.state.pa.us/>.

General Fee

There is a mandatory general fee of \$50/credit for part-time students or \$516 total for full-time students that covers services for Sykes Student Union, the Health Center, parking improvement, and the Educational Services fee.

Uncollectible Check Policy

A fee of \$25 is charged for any check returned to the University for any reason.

Refunds

Refunds are not automatic, and course or school withdrawal requires written notification to the Office of Graduate Studies. The amount of the refund depends on the date written notice of the withdrawal is recorded. In order to receive a 100 percent refund, a student must withdraw prior to or on the first day for each session. See refund schedule that follows.

Basic Fee Refund Policy – Summer 2010

A full refund will be issued if a student withdraws prior to the start of the summer session, or on the first day of class. Once the session begins, the following schedule is in effect:

COUNSELOR EDUCATION

Workshop in Counselor Education – Seminar for Counseling Excellence

EDC595 31 (3 credits) CL# 1794

EDC595 32 (3 credits) CL# 1796

July 5 – 9, 8 a.m. – 4 p.m.

The workshops will be conducted in a conference format and provide a forum for discussing current issues and trends, as well as an opportunity for advanced counselor training in specific presenting issues and diagnoses. Topics may include counselor credentialing and licensure process, laws affecting the practice of counseling, new practices as the result of recent school tragedies, training motivational interviewing, trends in career counseling, changes in ACA Ethical Code, diversity issues, grief/loss and complicated grief, use of humor in counseling, use and demonstration of music therapy, role and function trends of counselors in educational settings, counselor interventions for improving clients' self-esteem, the challenge of eating disorders, counselor intervention for relationship rejection, suicide prevention, drug and alcohol counseling, serving underachievers, and latest research information about what works in counseling. Workshop in Counselor Education – Alternative Counseling Techniques

EDC596 31 (3 credits) CL# 1798

July 12 – 16, 8 a.m. – 4 p.m.

The National Institute of Health reports that over 70% of the population uses complementary therapies. This workshop explores intervention modalities that are successful in addressing life issues such as stress management, smoking cessation, weight and pain management, and other behavior modification techniques. The modalities introduced include, but are not limited to, hypnosis, neurolinguistic programming, reiki, and yoga. The course provides students with an overview of these interventions through didactic and experiential activities as well as guest speakers. EARLY AND MIDDLE GRADES EDUCATION

Workshop in Humanizing Teaching – Different Learners, Different Strategies: Teaching Students from Diverse Cultures, Ethnicities, and Low Socioeconomic Backgrounds

EDE589 21 (3 credits) CL# 2015

June 17 – 23, 8 a.m. – 4 p.m.

This course will discuss how some ethnic, cultural, and low socioeconomic background students learn differently. Teachers will work

in groups to 1) understand why these factors affect students' attitudes and effort; 2) identify traditional teachers' beliefs and instructional practices that frustrate different learners; 3) discover how a different approach to managing a classroom may positively affect students' academic attitudes; and 4) identify instructional strategies that positively affect the learning of students from different backgrounds.

Special Topics – Enhancing Collegiality: Supervision and Mentoring Skills for Cooperating Teachers

EDE591 21 (3 credits) CL# 1904

June 21 – 25, 8 a.m. – 4 p.m.

This course affords teachers opportunities to develop knowledge and skills to become effective cooperating teachers. The class will examine and explore techniques that aid in the professional development of cooperating teachers by

- exploring ways for cooperating teachers and student teachers to establish strong rapport and good communication in the mentoring relationship;
- identifying cooperating teachers' learning style and how it translates into leadership and teaching styles;
- facilitating cooperating teachers in providing instructional support through modeling and developing reflective practice in their student teacher;
- learning and practicing observational skills which may help cooperating teachers gather data during student teacher observations;
- exploring a variety of feedback models to enhance the student teachers' growth;
- developing tools that can be used to assist conferencing and student teacher improvement;
- applying what is known about supervision, conferencing, and feedback to daily experiences with parents, students, and colleagues; and
- presenting the WCU Teacher Intern Performance Rating and the Pennsylvania Department of Education 430 Form as methods to convey evaluative information to student teachers.

Workshop in Humanizing Teaching – Teaching Diverse Students: Closing the Achievement Gap

EDE589 31 (3 credits) CL# 1941

June 28 – July 2, 8 a.m. – 4 p.m.

This course will examine the historical causes of the achievement gap between diverse students and their counterparts, as well as identify the current struggles diverse students

face. The focus will then shift to identifying students and schools that have been able to successfully close the achievement gap, despite the odds. The class will examine the factors in place that allowed those schools to be successful, and how other schools and/or classrooms can incorporate similar strategies.

Workshop in Humanizing Teaching – Differentiating Instruction for ELL's in K-12

EDE589 32 (3 credits) CL# 1942

June 28 – July 2, 8 a.m. – 4 p.m.

The workshop focuses on strategies and adaptations all teachers can use to improve the achievement of English language learners through a research-based model of instruction (the SIOP model). The class will work through the eight elements of the model, from planning to instructional delivery to evaluation, with hands-on activities and discussion, and will view videotaped teaching vignettes at the elementary, middle, and high school levels that highlight each of the elements.

Workshop in Humanizing Teaching – School Bullying: the Problem, Intervention, and Prevention

EDE589 33 (3 credits) CL# 1943

July 12 – 16, 8 a.m. – 4 p.m.

The workshop focuses on the issue of bullying in schools: understanding the problem by defining bullying; learning about the characteristics of bullies and victims, as well as the range of bullying behaviors; and looking at the short- and long-term consequences of bullying. The class will discuss effective intervention strategies for teachers and administrators, including comprehensive, school-wide anti-bullying programs. The approach will be hands-on, practical, and interactive.

Workshop in Humanizing Teaching – Differentiating Instruction by Using Personality Types and Learning Styles: Creating Success Opportunities for All Students

EDE589 34 (3 credits) CL# 1944

July 5 – 9, 8 a.m. – 4 p.m.

This multifaceted and interactive workshop will examine the evolution of different personality types and various learning styles. Special emphasis will be given to the "Mind" styles of Anthony Gregorc and the "True Colors Model" of Don Lowry. Through the introduction of new and varied strategies and techniques, participants are invited to apply this research to improved teaching and learning. The areas of specific focus will include creating a better classroom environment, enhancing all students' self-esteem, and improving the overall classroom climate.

Workshop in Humanizing Teaching – Integrating a Mexican Perspective

EDE589 35 (6 credits) CL# 1945

Trip date: June 22 – 27

Class pre/post meeting dates: June 8 and 15, and July 13, 7 p.m., on campus

This course is designed for teachers, administrators, and graduate students who are interested in understanding and meeting the needs of Mexican children in schools. The workshop includes a six-day cultural immersion in the state of Guanajuato, Mexico. In Mexico, workshop participants will visit Mexican schools, talk with Mexican educators, tour the city and state of Guanajuato, observe firsthand the lifestyle of Mexican families, and learn about the history and culture of Mexico by visiting museums and historic sites. An interpreter will accompany the group.

At the two pre-trip evening seminars, topics will include Mexican history and values, cross-cultural sensitivity, and trip logistics. At the evening seminar held after the trip, students will share their workshop projects. As a course requirement, students will complete a project from one of three options: an integrated thematic unit based on Mexican culture, an in-service for colleagues on working with Mexican children and their families, or an action plan for tailoring school/family relationships to address the needs of Mexican families. Special Topics – Violence Prevention:

Creating Healthy, Safe Environments

HEA435/581 20 (3 credits) CL# 2030

June 7 – 11, 9 a.m. – 5 p.m.

This course is designed to assist undergraduate/graduate students interested in examining this major public health issue. Since violence accounts for a great deal of our health problems, this class will differentiate between intentional and unintentional injuries; discuss societal and personal factors that contribute to violence in American society; explore the factors that contribute to homicide, domestic violence, school violence, sexual victimization, and other intentional acts of violence; and discuss strategies to prevent intentional injuries and reduce the risk of occurrence. Students will analyze case studies and identify resources/programs that work to address violence in settings such as schools, communities, families, and the workplace. Current Issues in Public Health

HEA 581 30 (3 credits) CL# 1882

July 13, 14, 15, 16 and 19, 8 a.m. – 5 p.m.

This seminar will highlight public health practice as a strategic approach to finding solutions for several, often interlinked, health, economic, political, and social issues, both nationally and globally. Current perspectives and available research findings will guide critical thinking and discussion of challenging public health issues such as health systems strengthening, workforce development, burden of infectious diseases and injuries, chronic disease management, disaster planning and emergency preparedness, millennium development goals, women's empowerment, and human rights. Population-based health promotion and disease prevention approaches, public-private partnerships, and creative resource allocation models will be explored. Active engagement of participants in the learning process is required. All majors are welcome, and no prerequisites are required. Special Topics – Advanced Biostatistical Methods

HEA581 31 (3 credits) CL# 1532

June 29 – July 29, 4:15 – 8:45 p.m.

This team-taught course allows students to evaluate health-related research questions by completing an epidemiologic study and producing a draft manuscript. Statistical methods to be covered in the course include multiple linear regression, logistic regression, survival analysis, and an introduction to longitudinal data analysis. Participants will apply epidemiologic and biostatistical skills for designing and analyzing epidemiologic studies, learn by working effectively with others as team members, and gain skills by presenting study results orally and in writing, includ-

ing a brief manuscript. All analyses will be conducted with PASW (formerly SPSS). The prerequisite for this course is a “B” or better in HEA526 (Biostatistics in Public Health).

Special Topics – Contemporary Culture, Media, and Health

HEA581 40 (3 credits) CL# 1162

August 2 – 6, 8 a.m. – 5 p.m.

This course is open to undergraduate and graduate students from all disciplines with the purpose of investigating how contemporary culture and media affects people's health. The course will focus on contemporary culture across industrialized nations, as well as various cultures within the United States.

The course will emphasize the effects of media on psychological, physiological, social, and emotional health. Numerous media channels will be studied, including entertainment (television, movies, video games), advertising (billboards, commercials, radio advertisements), and informational (Internet, news programs, newspapers, e-mail, magazines). This course will also include the effects of media on medical self-care and will promote students to analyze how media impacts their own health.

LITERACY

Literacy Workshop – Using Nonfiction in Your Classroom: Nothing but the Truth

EDR592 31 (6 credits) CL# 1877

June 28 – July 9, 8:30 a.m. – 4:30 p.m.

This class is a dynamic, hands-on workshop that offers strategies, materials, and activities for teachers to help children engage and excel in the content areas, most notably math, social studies, and science. Projects, experiments, and other approaches will be shared to help participants get to the content of these disciplines through inquiry and research. Literature connections, both nonfiction and fiction, will abound. The workshop will introduce, demonstrate, and model a variety of materials and activities that are closely aligned to the Pennsylvania State Standards in each area and provide a forum for a strong component of teacher sharing as preparation for the PSSA Standards. Further, teachers will have ample opportunity to develop and construct materials to take back to their classrooms.

Literacy Workshop – Folk and Fairy Tales: Bringing Magic Back into Your Classroom

EDR591 31 (6 credits) CL# 1802

July 12 – 23, 8:30 a.m. – 4:30 p.m.

“Once upon a time...” is revisited in this engaging workshop where participants will become reacquainted with Rapunzel, Snow White, and Anansi, characters most people have known and loved since childhood, and meet anew many more folktale characters from across the world. This class will illustrate how to make these engaging stories come

alive in the classroom using puppetry and storytelling techniques, as well as many other hands-on activities that will broaden participants' knowledge of this children's literature genre and provide the tools for introducing these tales to students. The workshop will introduce a wide range of folktale types and allow teachers to create materials and develop units for the classroom that align with PSSA Standards for reading across a variety of genres.

Music: Applied

Vocal-Choral Workshop – Conducting Brahms

VOC536 21 (3 credits) CL# 1806

June 21 – 25, 8 a.m. – 4:30 p.m.

The course will feature an in-depth look at Brahms's famous choral work *Ein deutsches requiem*, focusing on the history and genesis of the piece, approaches to score study, and practical approaches to conducting the work.

Special Subjects Seminar – Drum Set for Music Educators

AIM679 33 (3 credits) CL# 1638

June 28 – July 2, 8 a.m. – 4:30 p.m.

This workshop is designed to teach participants all the basics for working with drummers in a rhythm section. Learn how to interpret big band and combo charts and how to teach drummers the basics of good time keeping. Every participant will be provided with his/her own drum set for learning essential grooves, tuning, set up, and drum head and cymbal selection.

Special Subjects Seminar – Jazz Workshop

AIM679 31 (3 credits) CL# 1634

Students will study the pedagogy of jazz performance, the importance of jazz history, jazz ensemble performance, and instructional techniques.

Special Subjects Seminar – World Percussion

This workshop focuses on incorporating world music into the general music class curriculum for both the elementary and middle school levels. Students will develop lesson plans using African, Brazilian, Latin, and Caribbean rhythms and music. Workshop participants will play on steel drums, African drums, and traditional Brazilian samba band instruments.

Marching Band Workshop

MWB539 31 (3 credits) CL# 1879

July 27 – 30, 8 a.m. – 4:30 p.m.

This workshop will provide directors with individual and classroom instruction in drill design, rehearsal techniques, computer-generated drill, color guard implementation and design, and percussion utilization in the

Music Education Workshop – First Steps in Music: Becoming Tuneful, Beatful, and Artful

Topical Seminar: Body Image

Workshop: Special Education I – Urban Schools and Culturally Linguistically Diverse (CLD) Students with Special Needs

EDA592 31 (3 credits) CL# 1951

July 6, 7, 8, 9, 12, 13, 9 a.m. – 5 p.m.

This course examines special educational reform policies and practices within the context of larger societal issues, with an emphasis on

both the stated and unstated goals of reforms such as IDEA (2004) and NCLB (2001), as well as their intended and unintended consequences. School and curricular reform policy is often borne out of general concerns regarding the conditions of education in urban settings and the quality of the education for poor students and students of color. An often-overlooked category under IDEA and NCLB encompasses students with “special needs” who come from CLD backgrounds and attend “high-needs” urban schools. The course examines social, political, and historical characteristics of urban students eligible for services under IDEA, as well as their families and communities, with an emphasis on the diversity within and across CLD students’ backgrounds. Additionally, this course seeks to construct relevant pedagogy and practices that can engage these students and their families to increase academic achievement and performance, as well as enhance family/school collaboration.
