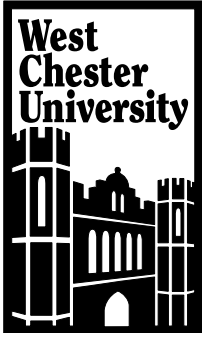

2011 Graduate Summer and Fall Calendar and Registration Information

Scheduling

Graduate students who have been accepted into a program should meet with their adviser, prior to the start of scheduling, to plan their course work for the upcoming session. Beginning Sunday, February 27, 2011, matriculated students currently in a graduate program may schedule online through their myWCU account. Nondegree students who have not been formally accepted into a graduate program may schedule at the Office of Graduate Studies and Extended Education or complete a registration form at www.wcupa.edu/grad (look under **Announcements** for the nondegree registration form) beginning Monday, March 13, 2011. Students should register for classes early in the scheduling period. Class availability toward the end of the scheduling period is limited.

The University/department reserves the right to drop from the class roster any student who schedules for course work without appropriate prerequisites or approvals.

Before You Self-Schedule

1. The summer/fall 2011 graduate course schedule (course offerings) is available online at www.wcupa.edu/grad and on myWCU.
2. You should contact your adviser before scheduling to discuss what course work should be taken.
3. All University bills must be paid in full and all holds must be cleared before you are eligible to schedule (including tuition, housing, meals, bookstore, library, and parking tickets). You should check your myWCU account for existing holds.

Accessing Your WCU E-mail Account

1. Go to the WCU homepage, www.wcupa.edu.
2. Under Campus Connections click on **Webmail**.
3. Under the **Student E-mail Log-In**, click **Initialize/Change Password**.
4. Enter your WCU username (i.e., the first initial of your first name and the first initial of your last name followed by the last six digits of your University ID number and then the e-mail domain. John Doe's username might look like this: JD123456@wcupa.edu.)
5. Your initial (or **Old**) password is **WCU-** followed by your date of birth in MMDDYY format (e.g., Jan. 1, 1986 would be WCU-010186).
6. In the **New Password** and the **Verify New Password** fields, create a password that is at least eight characters and includes

at least three of the following:

- Lowercase character(s)
- Uppercase character(s)
- Numeric character(s)
- Special character(s) such as # \$ *

You may not use any part of your name in your new password.

7. Click **Change Pwd**.

To Access myWCU for the First Time

- Go to <https://my.wcupa.edu>.
 - In the middle of the page, find **New/First-Time Students** and follow **click here**. Enter your user name (i.e., the first initial of your first name and the first initial of your last name followed by the last six digits of your University ID number and then the e-mail domain. John Doe's username might look like this: JD123456@wcupa.edu).
 - Follow the instructions on how to create a password.

Continuous Registration Reminder

All students who have been admitted to a graduate program must maintain continuous registration each **fall** and **spring** semester. If you are not enrolling in a course, you must request continuous registration (GSR 799). **You are not able to self-register for continuous registration.** Contact the Graduate Office at 610-436-2943 to schedule continuous registration; no fees are charged. How to Request Pennsylvania

Act 48 Hours/Credits

Professional educators can now request submission of their Act 48 hours to the Pennsylvania Department of Education directly on the Web.

How It Works

- After completing a class at West Chester University for which you wish to receive Act 48 credit, log on to **Edulink** at <http://www.act48hours.com>.
- Enter the information about the class as directed.
- The WCU Office of the Registrar will verify that the hours and credits were satisfactorily completed.
- WCU will submit the verified hours/credits to the Pennsylvania Department of Education records management site.

What to Do

- Visit www.act48hours.com.
- Click on **Professional Educator**.
- Click on **Register** (if you are a first-time user of this automated system), or click on **Log On** (if you have used the system before).
- Click on **Submission of Credits**.
- Enter the requested information and click **Submit**.

Your request will be sent to West Chester University. After we verify that the hours/credits were completed, we will submit your credits to the Pennsylvania Department of Education records management site.

You may check your Act 48 progress at the Department of Education records management site. Click on **Check Educator's Continuing Education Progress** and enter your Social Security number. The site address is <http://perm.ed.state.pa.us/>.

Graduation Reminder

The commencement ceremony for graduate students is separate from the undergraduate ceremony. The graduate ceremony is Monday, December 19, 2011 at 7 p.m. in Hollinger Field House. All graduate students intending to graduate on that date must apply for graduation no later than Monday, October 3, 2011. Students may apply for graduation online using myWCU.

General Fee

There is a mandatory general fee of \$65.24/credit for part-time students or \$691.20 total for full-time students that covers services for Sykes Student Union, the Health Center, parking improvement, and the Educational Services fee.

Uncollectible Check Policy

A fee of \$25 is charged for any check returned to the University for any reason.

Refunds

Refunds are not automatic, and course or school withdrawal requires written notification to the Office of Graduate Studies. The amount of the refund depends on the date written notice of the withdrawal is recorded. In order to receive a 100 percent refund, a student must withdraw prior to or on the first day for each session. See refund schedule that follows.

Basic Fee Refund Policy – Summer 2011

A full refund will be issued if a student withdraws prior to the start of the summer session, or on the first day of class. Once the session begins, the following schedule is in effect:

Basic Fee Refund Policy – Fall 2011

Summer 2011 Workshop Descriptions

COUNSELOR EDUCATION

Seminar for Counseling Excellence

EDC 595 31 (3 credits) CL#1461

EDC 595 32 (3 credits) CL#1463

June 27 – July 1, 8 a.m. – 4 p.m.

The workshops will be conducted in a conference format and provide a forum for discussing current issues and trends, as well as an opportunity for advanced counselor training in specific presenting issues and diagnoses. Topics may include counselor credentialing and licensure process, laws affecting the practice of counseling, new practices as the result of recent school tragedies, motivational interviewing, trends in career counseling, changes in ACA Ethical Code, diversity issues, grief/loss and complicated grief, use of humor in counseling, alternative counseling techniques, the changing role and function of counselors in educational settings, the challenge of eating disorders, post-traumatic stress disorders, suicide prevention, drug and alcohol counseling, serving underachievers, and the latest research about what works in counseling.

EARLY AND MIDDLE GRADES EDUCATION

Workshop in Humanizing Teaching and Learning – Different Learners, Different Strategies: Teaching Students from Diverse Ethnic, Cultural, and Low Socioeconomic Backgrounds

EDE 589 21 (3 credits) CL#2178

June 20 – 24, 8:15 a.m. – 3:45 p.m.

This workshop will discuss how some ethnic, cultural, and low socioeconomic background students learn differently. Teachers will work in groups to understand *oppositional identity*, classroom management techniques for diverse students, strategies that assist English language learners, and identify instructional strategies that positively affect the learning of students from different ethnic, cultural, and low socioeconomic backgrounds.

Enhancing Collegiality: Supervision and Mentoring Skills for Cooperating Teachers

EDE 591 21 (3 credits) CL#1587

June 20 – 24, 8 a.m. – 4 p.m.

This course, which includes an online component, affords teachers opportunities to develop knowledge and skills in becoming effective cooperating teachers. The class will examine and explore techniques that aid in the professional development of cooperating teachers by

- exploring ways for cooperating teachers and student teachers to establish strong rapport and good communication in the mentoring relationship;

- identifying cooperating teachers' learning style and how that style translates into leadership and teaching styles;
- facilitating cooperating teachers in providing instructional support through modeling and developing reflective practice in their student teacher;
- learning and practicing observational skills which may help cooperating teachers gather data during student teacher observations;
- exploring a variety of feedback models to enhance the growth of the student teacher;
- developing tools that can be used to assist conferencing and student teacher improvement;
- applying what is known about supervision, conferencing, and feedback to daily experiences with parents, students, and colleagues; and
- presenting the WCU Teacher Intern Performance Rating and the Pennsylvania Department of Education 430 Form as methods to convey evaluative information to student teachers.

Workshop in Curriculum Enrichment – Understanding Young Adolescent Development: Implications for Middle-Level Teachers

EDE 586 31 (3 credits) CL#1987

July 11 – 15, 8 a.m. – 3:45 p.m.

This workshop will study the cognitive, socioemotional, physical, and identity developmental processes of young adolescents. Find out why they are so different from adolescents in high school and why they “act that way.” Discover what a genuine middle school looks like and examine how participants' schools match up to the ones that young adolescents need. Interact with colleagues to study practices like advisories, exploratories, flexible scheduling, and integrated curriculum to determine how they help young adolescents.

Workshop in Humanizing Teaching and Learning – School Bullying: The Problem, Intervention, and Prevention

EDE 589 31 (3 credits) CL#1986

July 11 – 15, 8 a.m. – 4 p.m.

The course provides an overview of the national and international problem of bullying in schools. It explores such questions as, Why is bullying an important concern for teachers? How is bullying defined, what are the typical characteristics of bullies and victims, and what is the range of possible bullying behaviors? What can teachers and administrators do to alleviate and prevent bullying and its consequences? Through readings, discussions, in-class learning activities, videos, and guest speaker presentations, participants will come

to a better understanding of bullying and school violence, and explore ways educators can act to safeguard all students. The class will also examine recent media coverage, cyberbullying, related Web sites and organizations, and literature, including children's literature. The course contains a counseling component and explores the issues of emotions and behavior management.

Integration of Curriculum and Instruction with Global Perspectives

EDE 589 41 (3 credits) CL#1198

July 28 – 29, August 1 – 3, 9 a.m. – 5 p.m.

This workshop will discuss the rationale of global education and specific strategies to incorporate global education in the current curriculum. Designed for teachers who believe students should develop the skills for living in this interdependent world, this workshop also benefits those who are interested in enhancing their personal international skills to help in today's environment. The workshop will be presented in an active learning and hands-on mode.

HEALTH

Contemporary Culture, Media, and Health

HEA 435/581 21 (3 credits) CL#1671

May 16 – 20, 9 a.m. – 5 p.m.

This course investigates how contemporary culture and media affects human health across a variety of health topic areas, focusing on contemporary culture across industrialized nations, as well as various populations and cultures within the United States. The class will emphasize the effects of media on psychological, physiological, social, and emotional health. A multitude of media channels will be studied including entertainment (television, movies, video games), advertising (billboards, commercials, radio advertisements), and informational (Internet, news programs, newspapers, e-mail, magazines). This course will also include the effects of media on medical self-care, and students will analyze how media impacts their own health.

Violence Prevention: Creating Healthy Safe Environments

HEA 435/581 20 (3 credits) CL#1665

June 6 – 10, 9 a.m. – 5 p.m.

This course is designed to assist undergraduate/graduate students interested in examining this major public health issue. Since violence accounts for various health problems, this class will 1) differentiate between intentional and unintentional injuries; 2) discuss societal and personal factors that contribute to violence in American society; 3) explore the factors that contribute to homicide, domestic violence, school violence, sexual victimization, and oth-

er intentional acts of violence; and 4) discuss strategies to prevent intentional injuries and reduce the risk of occurrence. Students will analyze case studies and identify resources/programs that work to address violence in settings such as schools, communities, families, and the workplace.

Health Promotion and Health

Counseling

HEA 435/ 581 30 (3 credits) CL#1621
July 11 – 15, 8 a.m. – 5 p.m.

This course will provide an overview of health counseling theory and practice in health-promotion programs and settings with specific applications to common health problems. How to work with individuals and self-help groups is covered. The course's framework is based on Ivey's Microskills model, a psycho-educational approach that breaks counseling into discrete skills, which can be mastered and applied easily.

LITERACY

Keep a Poem in Your Pocket: Poetry in All Grades and Subjects

EDR 593 31 (6 credits) CL#2018
June 27 – July 8, 8:30 a.m. – 4:30 p.m.

Poetry is always a sure bet to brighten any cold and rainy afternoon, but how can it be used daily to enhance teachers' reading and writing programs as well as bolster every subject area? Learn how in this dynamic workshop that provides teachers and librarians with hands-on strategies, materials, and activities in using poetry every day at every grade level and in all subject areas. The instructor will introduce ideas he used in his own elementary and middle school classrooms and provide teachers with time to read widely, sampling his vast poetry collection. The course also will include a live Skype visit with veteran children's poet J. Patrick Lewis. Participants will have ample opportunity to construct the materials they want to bring back to their classrooms.

Teaching It Write: Writing Instruction with a Flair for ALL the Grades

EDR 595 31 (6 credits) CL#2019
July 11 – 22, 8:30 a.m. – 4:30 p.m.

This hands-on, dynamic workshop offers strategies, materials, and activities for helping all children learn to write in creative and productive ways. It makes writing instruction easily accessible, unlocking even the "blocked and challenged writer." The workshop focuses on developing an insight into the process of writing and a writer's workshop, providing a forum that encourages creativity and divergent thinking. The course will introduce, demonstrate, and model a variety of materials and activities that are closely aligned to the PSSA Standards as well as those of the National Council of Teachers of English and the International Reading Association. Participants will have ample opportunity to

construct the materials they want to bring back to their classrooms.

MUSIC: APPLIED

Jazz Workshop

AIM 679 31 (3 credits) CL#1015
July 10 – 15, 8 a.m. – 4:30 p.m.

Students will study the pedagogy of jazz performance, the importance of jazz history, jazz ensemble performance, and instructional techniques.

Drum Set for Music Educators

AIM 679 33 (3 credits) CL#2055
July 18 – 22, 8 a.m. – 4:30 p.m.

This seminar is designed to teach the basics for working with drummers in a rhythm section. Learn how to interpret big band and combo charts and how to teach drummers the basics of good time keeping. This course will provide educators with the tools to help their drummers and rhythm section succeed. Every student will be provided with his or her own drum set to play during class.

Developing a Successful Independent Music Career

AIM 679 34 (2 credits) CL#2053
July 18 – 22, 10 a.m. – 4 p.m.

This seminar is designed to educate students and music teachers about music career possibilities and help them examine inner workings of the music industry. Each class will provide lectures and/or panel discussions on important topics, including career opportunities, becoming a soloist, marketing, starting an ensemble, effective publicity, the recording industry, legal rights, composers and arrangers, applying for college teaching positions, fund raising, and more.

Alexander Technique

AIM 679 35 (3 credits) CL#2051
June 27 – July 29, MTW, 4 – 7 p.m.

People who engage in physical activities, either at work and play, that require repetitive motion are at risk for severe injury if they do not practice proper procedures, e.g., office workers contracting carpal tunnel syndrome or golf pros suffering career-ending back injury. Musicians pursuing careers on the concert stage are particularly susceptible to repetitive-motion injuries from extended practice sessions if they over-stress muscles of the hands, neck, and back. This course introduces the research of F. M. Alexander and uses his extraordinary "technique" to educate participants about how to reduce the threat of severe injury, deal with painful conditions, and manage frustration when injuries make it impossible to accomplish goals. Added values include an increase in positive self-image.

Marching Band Workshop

MWB 536 31 (3 credits) CL#1041
July 26 – 29, 8 a.m. – 4:30 p.m.

The marching band conference and workshop will provide directors with individual

and classroom instruction in drill design, rehearsal techniques, computer-generated drill, color guard implementation and design, and percussion utilization in the marching band. In addition, student sessions are offered in the following areas: marching band, percussion, silk, rifle, saber, majorette, drill team, and drum major. This workshop has received national acclaim for the introduction of contemporary marching band techniques. An additional fee is charged for housing. Please call 800-264-1121 for a brochure.

MUSIC EDUCATION

Teaching Chinese and Hispanic Musics

MUE 679 31 (2 credits) CL#1004
June 27 – July 1, 8 a.m. – 4 p.m.

This seminar provides an exploration of song, instrumental performance, and movement of music from China, Taiwan, Malaysia, Spain, Mexico, and the southwestern United States. Particular attention will be given to connecting to communities and cultures within the participants' schools.

Standards-Based Music Education with Technology

MUE 679 32 (3 credits) CL#1012
July 18 – 22, 8 a.m. – 4:30 p.m.

Sets of educational standards impact the design of curriculum and the delivery of instruction in all disciplines, and music is no exception. Standards that influence technology-based instruction in music include those published by MENC, TI:ME, ISTE, and other organizations. This course will explore these and other sets of standards, as well as the ways they might impact music teaching and learning. The class will examine the latest software and hardware technologies and their uses in addressing standards-based curriculum development and teaching. Particular focus will be on using technology to teach music content, often not included because of its interdisciplinary nature and historical connections.

Songwriting and Composition for Guitar

MUE 679 41 (3 credits) CL#1011
August 1 – 5, 8 a.m. – 4:30 p.m.

This class is offered to students who have taken guitar playing Level I or have been playing the guitar for a few years already. Students in this class will further develop their guitar skills, explore how to compose music in the classroom using the guitar, and create/revise a guitar curriculum for their school setting.

PROFESSIONAL AND SECONDARY EDUCATION

Developing Effective School-Based

Interventions for the ADHD Child

EDF 599 32 (3 credits) CL#1579
July 18 – 22, 8 a.m. – 4 p.m.

Over the past decade, ADHD has become the most widely studied childhood

disorder. Disagreements over diagnosis and interventions have led to confusion regarding the way teachers and counselors should approach management of this disorder. This workshop will provide a comprehensive model for intervention based on recent research, as well as clinical and school-based experience. Research-identified disorder symptoms, considerations for intervening with families, issues of co-morbidity, and core principles for effective school-based interventions will be presented.

Teaching with Interactive Whiteboard

EDF 599 42 (3 credits) CL#1086

August 1– 5, 8 a.m. – 5 p.m.

This workshop is for teachers who are interested in learning how to use interactive whiteboard in the classroom. Participants will create a lesson plan for an interactive lesson using a whiteboard and will present it to the other workshop participants. Class members will learn whiteboard intricacies, what resources are available, and how to manage the technology. The course is for participants at all levels of computer knowledge.

Google for Educators

EDS 599 42 (3 credits) CL#1094

August 8 – 12, 8 a.m. – 5 p.m.

Students, teachers, and staff can complete work and share ideas more quickly and effectively when they use Google applications and services. With Google applications there's no hardware or software to install or buy. Everything is delivered through a standard Web browser – anytime, from anyplace. This workshop is appropriate for all K-12 teachers and will cover Google Advanced Search, Google Earth, iGoogle, Google Talk, Google Notebook, Google Docs, Google Groups, and Google Sites.

Designing Inquiry-Based Projects

EDS 599 43 (3 credits) CL#1193

August 8 – 12, 8 a.m. – 5 p.m.

Is homework effective at increasing achievement? Do students learn better when they are taught according to their learning style? Can viewing cartoons increase aggressive behavior in students? Does the current generation of students really differ from past generations? What are students' beliefs about the future? More and more, society is relying on data to answer such questions. In order to succeed in their professions, students need to interpret reports of inquiry-based projects that have been done by others, as well as design their own inquiries to find answers to the questions they have. This hands-on workshop will provide the basics of teaching students to design and conduct such inquiry-based studies. The workshop itself will model these skills. Participants will practice in groups using fun and entertaining exercises that they can take back to their own classrooms. Success in this course only requires a basic understanding of mathematics. Teachers from any grade level are invited.

Applied Learning Seminar

EEE 503 (3 credits) CL#1183

August 1 – 5, 8 a.m. – 4 p.m.

Participants deepen their understanding behind the theory and practice of inquiry-based learning. They investigate the scientific basis of inquiry-based instruction and then examine Problem-Based Learning (PBL) as an exemplar of this instructional approach. Participants study problem design and create their own inquiry-based module(s) for K-12 classroom use. The course will be differentiated based upon participants' knowledge and experience with inquiry-based learning.

The class meets in a full, week-long format preceded by readings and assignments before and independent projects completed after that week. This course is an elective of the College of Education graduate certificate in entrepreneurial education. SPECIAL EDUCATION

Urban Schools and Culturally and Linguistically Diverse (CLD) Students With Special Needs

EDA 592 31 (3 credits) CL#2060

July 6 – 8, 11 – 12, 9 a.m. – 5 p.m.

This course examines special educational reform policies and practices within the context of larger societal issues, with an emphasis on both the stated and unstated goals of reforms such as IDEA (2004) and NCLB (2001), as well as their intended and unintended consequences. School and curricular reform policy is often borne out of general concerns regarding the conditions of education in urban settings and the quality of the education for low-economic students and students of color. An often-overlooked category under IDEA and NCLB is students with special needs who come from CLD backgrounds and attend high-needs urban schools. The course examines social, political, and historical characteristics of urban students eligible for services under IDEA, as well as their families and communities, with an emphasis on the diversity within and across CLD students' backgrounds. Additionally, this course seeks to construct relevant pedagogy and practices that can engage these students and their families to increase academic achievement, performance, and enhance family/school collaboration.
