

Robin C. Leonard Ph.D.



Dr. Leonard is currently on the faculty of the Department of Health at West Chester University. She teaches Public Health Epidemiology and Health Program Evaluation, which are core courses in the Master of Public Health Program. She also teaches undergraduate courses in transcultural health and chronic and communicable diseases.

Before joining the university, Dr. Leonard managed the occupational epidemiology program at DuPont from 1998 until 2008. Prior to that, she was Manager of Epidemiology at ARCO Chemical Company for seven years, where she initiated the worldwide mortality registries for all U.S. and European sites. She has also held project manager positions with Clement International and with

Consultants in Epidemiology and Occupational Health, biological and health sciences consulting firms in Washington, DC. She also served on the research staff of the Medical Department at Brookhaven National Laboratory for five years. Dr. Leonard holds a Ph.D. in Human Genetics from the Medical College of Virginia, and a B.S. in biology from the College of Charleston, Charleston, S.C. Her formal epidemiology training was obtained through NIH postdoctoral fellowships at the University of N.C., Chapel Hill, and the Johns Hopkins School of Hygiene and Public Health. She was an instructor at JHU in the Department of Epidemiology from 1981-1982, and was on the adjunct faculty at the Jefferson Medical College of the Thomas Jefferson University in Philadelphia for three years. Dr. Leonard served on the Board of Scientific Counselors for the Agency for Toxic Substances and Disease Registry for four years.
