IMPORTANT INFORMATION ON SELECTING DEGREE ELECTIVES

*Students select one of the following Elective Areas within which they complete the 15 elective credits required for the major: Wellness, Multicultural Health Issues, or Integrative Health. All 15 credits of electives must be taken within a declared elective area. See the department or degree advisor for the latest list of eligible electives; sample electives are attached.

IMPORTANT ADVISING INFORMATION : Advisors are assigned to all students. Advising appointments are needed to help students make appropriate elective choices and plan for core course sequencing. Advisors meet with students during scheduled office hours or through appointments. It is important to note that advisors are not always available during the summer months and advising issues may not be resolved immediately, therefore it is important for students to schedule advising appointments during fall/spring semesters.

Course Sequencing: Some of the health sciences core courses are only offered once a year. Please refer to the advising sheet for course sequencing. Students who miss a course may delay their graduation date. Please check with advisors to make sure that courses are taken in appropriate sequence.

Developmental Courses – O credit courses do not count as credits for the degree. Students with developmental courses will need to make sure they do not count these credits toward the 120 credits needed for the degree. If students take all the courses listed on the Student Advising Sheet, they will obtain 120 degree credits.

Writing Emphasis Courses. Three writing emphasis courses (W) are required if a student transfers less than 40 credits; two courses are required if 40-70 credits are transferred; and one is required if more than 70 credits are transferred. W courses do not transfer in. At least one W course must be at the 300 or 400 level.

Interdisciplinary Course. One interdisciplinary course (I) is required. ENV 102 Humans and the Environment is recommended.

Diverse Communities Course. One diverse communities course (J) is required. HEA 110 Transcultural Health is recommended.
