About the summer Youth Programs

The summer Youth Programs are sponsored by the Pennsylvania Writing and Literature Project (PAWLP), West Chester University (WCU), select school districts in the Delaware Valley, and several private locations.

Classes are small, averaging 13 - 15 students. Students are grouped by age. Teachers are prepared to teach multi-age classes.

PAWLP, a National Writing Project site, is a professional network of teachers who promote student achievement through quality instruction.

All directors, site coordinators, and teachers are Fellows of the National Writing Project as well as experienced classroom teachers.

Classes for younger students

Connect, Compose, Create for grades 3 - 4 (Code: NOR-CCC1 and NOR-CCC2) Do you like unique types of writing? Do you want to write brief but brilliant pieces? Do you prefer short reading assignments? Do you enjoy fun reading/writing follow-ups? If the answer to these questions is “Yes,” then you’ll love this mini-course. (One-week at York Avenue ES, North PennSD)

Meet me in the Treehouse for grades 1 - 2 (Code: L-Tree1 and 2) Join us for a week-long adventure at Longwood Gardens inspired by the exciting tree house exhibit. Students have the opportunity to read, write, and explore nature in this wonderful setting. (One-week)

Nature Journaling for grades 3 - 6 (Code: H-NJ) If you like to draw and write, this workshop is for you! Discover new ways to write about the world around you. In a landscaped garden, fields, and woods, students will observe, explore, sketch, and write. Let nature journaling tell the stories of where you've been and what you've seen! (One-week at the Highlands Historical Society)

Reading and Writing with the Arts for grades 1 - 2 (Code: WCU-RWA1 and 2) Enjoy playing bongo drums, singing, moving, and listening to music with writing and reading activities. Also explore creating art and song with your writing. (One-week at West Chester University)

Reading, Writing and Talking History for grades 3 - 6 (Code: H-HW) Heat up the past. Become a history explorer. Investigate primary sources like diaries, letters, buildings, photos, artifacts, and more. Turn your investigations and discoveries into writing. Join us as we explore the stories that places can tell and make the past come alive again. Students meet at The Highlands Historical Society three days and one day each at Peter Wentz Farmstead and Graeme Park. (One-week)

What's the Buzz? for grades 3 - 4 (Code: L-Buzz1 and 2) Come discover the amazing insects and plants at Longwood Gardens. Take daily excursions into different parts of the gardens, and use your discoveries as inspiration for reading and writing in a workshop setting. Explore multiple genres of writing and polish one or more of your written pieces for publication. (One-week)

Young Writers/Young Readers. Grade levels vary by location. See charts for dates, times, and codes. (Code ends in -YW/YR) Learn writing in a relaxed, non-threatening camp environment. Try age-appropriate strategies and gain confidence in your writing. Compose, share, explore new writing styles, edit, and confer. Participants will also share and explore quality children’s literature. (at West Chester University and in sponsoring school districts)

Classes for older students

Creative Writing for Teens Using the Visual Arts for grades 7 - 11 (Code: M-CWA) Explore connections between the visual arts, writing and literature in this inspiring workshop. Work with local writers and artists while developing new skills and approaches to your work. Let the James A. Michener Art Museum's collection inspire creations in the written and visual arts! (One-week)

Creative Writing Workshop for Teens for grades 6 - 8 (Code ends in -MS) and grades 9 - 12 (Code ends in -HS) In a workshop setting, create, revise, and share expressive pieces in a variety of genres. Activities that stimulate creativity, practices that hone the writer's craft, and critical analyses of masterworks help you give form to your voice. (Two-weeks at West Chester University and in sponsoring school districts)

Fantasy, Science Fiction, and Horror Writing for grades 6 - 12 (Code: WCU-SF) If you've spoken "to the darkness, alone, in the bitter watches of the night" then come and explore three powerful genres that can put a story to what you've seen. (Two-weeks at West Chester University)

Gothic, Fantasy, and Science Fiction Reading and Writing for grades 7 - 10 (Code: LMER-GFSF) You who enjoy indulging the creative expression of your imagination may wish to ruminate upon "a few rank sedges ... shadowy fantasies," consider the "visible mark of earthly imperfection," and contemplate the places that are "not down on any map; true places never are." Join us as we consider the craft of classic and contemporary masters within compelling literature and apply various literary techniques to our own written creations. (Two-weeks at Bala Cynwyd Middle School, Lower Merion SD)

Satire and Parody for grades 9 - 12 (Code: WCU-SP) Explore contemporary satire and parody from sources including song lyrics, poems, short stories, essays, and newspaper articles. Through examples, exercises, and plenty of opportunities for creative writing, develop several original works of satire. (Two-weeks at West Chester University)

Young Writers on Computers for grades 3 - 12 (Codes: WCU-YWC1 and WCU-YWC2) Students with word processing experience will work in a West Chester University computer lab to compose and edit their work using Microsoft Word. They will share ideas, confer, receive feedback, and respond to each other's writing. Students will also design their own anthology page layout on the computer. (Two-weeks)
