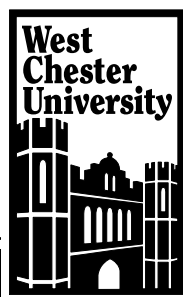

# Calendar and Registration Information

## Graduate Spring Session 2012



Graduate students who have been accepted into a program should meet with their adviser, prior to the start of scheduling, to plan their course work for the upcoming session. Beginning Sunday, October 23, 2011, you may schedule yourself on the Web using your myWCU account (my.wcupa.edu). Students who have not been formally accepted into a graduate program (nondegree students) may either schedule by completing an online scheduling form, found at [www.wcupa.edu/grad](http://www.wcupa.edu/grad) or in person at the Office of Graduate Studies, beginning Monday, November 7, 2011.

*The University/department reserves the right to drop any student from the class roster who schedules for course work without appropriate prerequisites or approvals.*

### Scheduling

Scheduling and payment begin October 23, 2011 for matriculated and newly admitted students and November 7, 2011 for nondegree students. Nondegree students may take up to nine credits in this classification. Scheduling concludes on the late registration date given for the session. Matriculated students may schedule using myWCU. Students should register for classes early in the scheduling period. Class availability toward the end of the scheduling period is limited.

### Before You Self-Schedule

1. The spring 2012 graduate course schedule (course offerings) is available on myWCU and the Graduate Studies homepage, [www.wcupa.edu/grad/](http://www.wcupa.edu/grad/).
2. You must contact your adviser before scheduling to discuss what course work should be scheduled.
3. All University bills must be paid in full, and all holds must be cleared before you are eligible to schedule (tuition, housing, meals, bookstore, library, parking tickets, etc.). You may use myWCU to check for existing holds.

### New Student Account Information

A student's West Chester University account serves four main purposes:

- Access to the student administration system (myWCU) which is used to access student information, grading, and class scheduling
- Access to WCU e-mail (webmail)
- Access to D2L which instructors use to post course materials and hold online discussions, tests, quizzes, and surveys
- Access to log onto the University network

Before new students can use their WCU account for any of the services listed above, they must first initialize their password.

To initialize your password, please follow these instructions:

1. In your browser type <http://www.wcupa.edu/>.
2. Next to the login box, click on the link labeled **Change Password**.
  - Enter your username (usernames are the first letter of your first name and the first letter of your last name followed by your six-digit WCU ID number). An example of this is BE123456@wcupa.edu.
  - If you have never logged into the system before, your "Old

Password" is WCU-MMDDYY. In your old password, be sure to capitalize the WCU and recognize that the MMD-DYY is a representation of your date of birth. An example of this is January 1, 1984 = WCU-010184.

- Enter a new password that is at least eight characters in length and includes at least three of the following requirements, then type that password again to confirm and click **Change Password/Passphrase**.
- Lowercase character
- Uppercase character
- Numeric character
- Special character such as # \$ \*

**Note:** You may not use any part of your name in your new password.

- For security reasons, you will be prompted to configure the self-service online password reset tool. Setting up this tool will enable you to reset your password at anytime. After you have completed setting up your questions and answers, click **Submit**.
- Your new password is good for 90 days.

### Continuous Registration Reminder

All students who have been admitted to a graduate program must maintain continuous registration each fall and spring semester. If you are not enrolling in a course, you must request continuous registration (GSR 799). You may do so by phone, fax, or in person. You are not able to self-register for continuous enrollment. You should call the Graduate Admissions Office (610-436-2943) to do this. There are no fees charged for continuous registration. Unless students continuously register, they will be dropped from the program. Students who plan not to enroll in course work for more than one semester must request a leave of absence. Forms are available online at [www.wcupa.edu/grad](http://www.wcupa.edu/grad); click on **Student Forms**.

### Graduation Reminder

The commencement ceremony for the graduate students is separate from the undergraduate ceremony. The graduate ceremony is Monday, May 14, 2012 at 7 p.m. in Hollinger Field House. All students intending to graduate on this date must submit an intent to graduate application no later than Tuesday, February 1, 2012. REFUNDS	Students wanting to withdraw completely from the University must submit that request in writing to the Office of Graduate Studies and Extended Education. A 100 percent refund is issued if the course is dropped or withdrawn through the sixth calendar day of the semester, Sunday, January 30, 2012. After that, tuition and fees are refunded according to the schedule below. These percentages apply to the total tuition bill, not to partial payments of tuition.

- WCU will submit the verified hours/credits to the Pennsylvania Department of Education Records management site.
