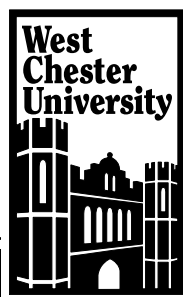
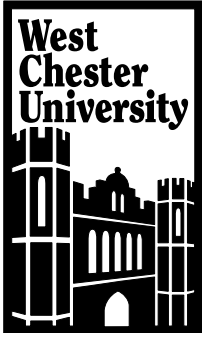

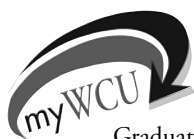

Calendar and Registration Information

Graduate Spring Session 2010



Graduate students who have been accepted into a program should meet with their adviser, prior to the start of scheduling, to plan their course work for the upcoming session. Beginning Sunday, October 25, 2009, you may schedule yourself on the Web using myWCU (my.wcupa.edu). Students who have not been formally accepted into a graduate program may either schedule in person by coming to the Office of Graduate Studies or by faxing their scheduling card to the office beginning Monday, November 8, 2009.

The University/department reserves the right to drop any student from the class roster who schedules for course work without appropriate prerequisites or approvals.

Scheduling

Scheduling and payment begin October 25, 2009 for matriculated and newly admitted students and November 8, 2009 for nondegree students. Scheduling concludes on the late registration date given for the session. Matriculated students may schedule using myWCU. Nondegree students are those who have not been admitted to a graduate program. They may take up to nine credits in this classification. To schedule, a nondegree student must obtain a scheduling card from the Office of Graduate Studies and, when necessary, the appropriate signatures.

Students should register for classes early in the scheduling period. Class availability toward the end of the scheduling period is limited.

Before You Self-Schedule

1. The spring 2010 graduate course schedule (course offerings) is available on myWCU. You will want to study the course schedule and then prepare a written schedule for yourself.
2. You must contact your adviser before scheduling to discuss what course work should be scheduled.
3. All University bills must be paid in full, and all holds must be cleared before you are eligible to schedule (tuition, housing, meals, bookstore, library, parking tickets, etc.). You may use myWCU to check for existing holds.

How to Self-Schedule Using myWCU

MyWCU (my.wcupa.edu) is the University portal that has access to enrollment, class schedules, grades, personal information, useful links, important announcements, and more.

Accessing Your WCU E-mail Account

1. Go to the WCU homepage, www.wcupa.edu.
2. Under **Application Access** click on **Webmail**.

3. Under the **Student E-mail Log-In**, click **Initialize/Change Password**.
4. Enter your WCU username (i.e., the first initial of your first name and the first initial of your last name followed by the last six digits of your University ID number and then the e-mail domain. John Doe's username might look like this: JD123456@wcupa.edu.)
5. Your initial (or **Old**) password is **WCU-** followed by your date of birth in MMDDYY format (e.g., Jan. 1, 1986 would be WCU-010186).
6. In the **New Password** and the **Verify New Password** fields, create a password that is at least eight characters and includes at least three of the following:
 - Lowercase character(s)
 - Uppercase character(s)
 - Numeric character(s)
 - Special character(s) such as # \$ *You may not use any part of your name in your new password.
7. Click **Change Pwd**.

To Access myWCU for the First Time

- Go to <https://my.wcupa.edu>.
 - In the middle of the page, find **New/First Time Students** and follow **click here**. Enter your user name (i.e., the first initial of your first name and the first initial of your last name followed by the last six digits of your University ID number and then the e-mail domain. John Doe's username might look like this: JD123456@wcupa.edu).
 - Follow the instructions on how to create a password.

Viewing Your University E-mail from Outside the University

All degree students are assigned an e-mail account. Academic advisers, instructors, and administrative offices will be sending you e-mail to this account address. You can view your e-mail using any Web browser or Internet provider. Here are the steps:

1. From your normal browser, go to <http://www.wcupa.edu> and click on **Application Access** and then **Webmail**.
2. Enter your username and password
3. Click on the **login** button.

Continuous Registration Reminder

All students who have been admitted to a graduate program must maintain continuous registration each fall and spring semester. If you are not enrolling in a course, you must request continuous registration. You may do so by phone, fax, or in person. You are not able to self-register for continuous enrollment. You should call the Graduate Admissions Office (610-436-2943) to do this. There are no fees charged for continuous registration. Unless students continuously register, they will be dropped from the program. Students who plan not to enroll in course work for more than one semester must request a leave of absence. Forms are available online at www.wcupa.edu/grad; click on **Forms**.

Graduation Reminder

The commencement ceremony for the graduate students is separate from the undergraduate ceremony. The graduate ceremony is Monday, May 10, 2010 at 7 p.m. in Hollinger Field House. All graduate students intending to graduate on Monday, May 10, 2010 must submit an intent to graduate application no later than Monday, February 1, 2010. Students may apply for graduation online using myWCU at my.wcupa.edu.

Keep for Future Reference

- If you schedule before late registration, you will receive a bill mailed to your home address.
- Students receive only one bill. If any changes are made to your schedule after the bill is sent, **you must contact the Office of the Bursar** for any updated charges. Or, you can review your charges on myWCU.
- The deadline for returning materials with payment is printed on the bill.

The University reserves the right to cancel schedules of students who do not pay or have not made arrangements for payment by their billing

due date. Students scheduling during late registration period, January 19–25, 2010, will be charged a late registration fee of \$35.

Tuition and fees may be paid by check, electronic check (e-check), money order, or cash. Credit card payments are accepted through the University's Web-based QuikPay system (with a fee assessed for the service). Refer to the Bursar's Web page for payment instructions.

REFUNDS	Students wanting to withdraw completely from the University must submit that request in writing to the Office of Graduate Studies and Extended Education. A 100 percent refund is issued if the course is dropped or withdrawn through the sixth calendar day of the semester, Monday, January 25, 2010. After that, tuition and fees are refunded according to the schedule below. These percentages apply to the total tuition bill, not to partial payments of tuition.

How to Request Pennsylvania Act 48 Hours/ Credits

Professional educators can now request the submission of their Act 48 hours to the Pennsylvania Department of Education directly on the Web.

How It Works

- After completing a class at West Chester University for which you wish to receive Act 48 credit, log on to **EduLink** at <http://www.act48hours.com>.
- Enter the information about the class as directed.
- The WCU Office of the Registrar will verify that the hours and credits were satisfactorily completed.
- WCU will submit the verified hours/credits to the Pennsylvania Department of Education Records management site.

What to Do

1. Visit www.act48hours.com/.
2. Click on **professional educator**.
3. Click on **register** (if you are a first-time user of this automated system), or click on **log on** (if you have used the system before).
4. Click on **request submission of credits/hours**.
5. Enter the requesting information and click **submit**.

Your request will be sent to West Chester University. After we verify that the hours/credits were completed, we will submit your credits to the Pennsylvania Department of Education Records management site.

You may check your Act 48 progress at the Pennsylvania Department of Education Records management site. Click on **check an educator's continuing education progress** and enter your Social Security number. The site address is <http://www.perm.ed.state.pa.us/>.
