Scheduling

Graduate students who have been accepted into a program should meet with their adviser, prior to the start of scheduling, to plan their course work for the upcoming session. Beginning Sunday, March 4, 2012, matriculated students currently in a graduate program may schedule online using their myWCU account (my.wcupa.edu). Students who have not been formally accepted into a graduate program (nondegree students) may either schedule by completing an online scheduling form, found at www.wcupa.edu/grad, or in person at the Office of Graduate Studies, beginning March 19, 2012.

The University/department reserves the right to drop from the class roster any student who schedules for course work without appropriate prerequisites or approvals.

Before You Self-Schedule

1. The summer/fall 2012 graduate course schedule (course offerings) is available on myWCU and the Graduate Studies homepage, www.wcupa.edu/grad/.
2. You must contact your adviser before scheduling to discuss what course work should be taken.
3. All University bills must be paid in full and all holds must be cleared before you are eligible to schedule (tuition, housing, meals, bookstore, library, and parking tickets). You may use myWCU to check for existing holds.

New Student Account Information

A student's West Chester University Account serves four main purposes:

- Access to the student administration system (myWCU) – myWCU is used to access student information, grading, and class scheduling
- Access to WCU e-mail (webmail)
- Access to D2L which is used by instructors to post course materials, tests, quizzes, and surveys, as well as hold online discussions
- Access to log onto the University network

Before new students can use their WCU account for any of the above services, they must first initialize their password.

To initialize your password, please follow these instructions:

1. In your browser type <http://www.wcupa.edu/>.
 2. Next to the login box, click on the link labeled **Change Password**.
- Enter your username (usernames are the first letter of your

first name and the first letter of your last name followed by your six-digit WCU ID number). An example of this is BE123456@wcupa.edu.

- If you have never logged into the system before, your "Old Password" is **WCU-MMDDYY**. In your old password, be sure to **capitalize the WCU** and recognize that the MMDDYY is a representation of your birth date. An example of this is January 1, 1984 = WCU-010184.
- Enter a new password which is **at least eight characters in length** and includes **at least three of the following requirements**, then type that password again to confirm and click **Change Password/Passphrase**.
- Lowercase character
- Uppercase character
- Numeric character
- Special character such as # \$ *

Note: You may not use any part of your name in your new password.

- For security reasons, you will be prompted to configure the self-service online password reset tool. Setting up this tool will enable you to reset your password at anytime. After you have completed setting up your questions and answers, click **Submit**.
- Your new password is good for 90 days.



Continuous Registration Reminder

All students who have been admitted to a graduate program must maintain continuous registration each **fall** and **spring** semester. If you are not enrolling in a course, you must request continuous registration (GSR 799). You may do so by phone, fax, or in person. **You are not able to self register for continuous registration.** Contact the Graduate Office at 610-436-2943 to schedule continuous registration. Unless you continuously register, you will be dropped from the program. If you plan not to enroll in course work for more than one semester, you must request a leave of absence. Forms are available at www.wcupa.edu/grad; click on **Forms and Policies**.

Graduation Reminder

The commencement ceremony for graduate students is separate from the undergraduate ceremony. The graduate ceremony is Monday, December 17, 2012 at 7 p.m. in Hollinger Field House. All students intending to graduate on this date must apply for graduation through their myWCU account no later than October 1, 2012.

Keep for future reference

- If you schedule before late registration, you will receive a bill mailed to your home address.
- Students receive only one bill. If any changes are made to your schedule after the bill is sent, **you must contact the Office of the Bursar** for any updated charges. Or, you can review your charges on myWCU.
- The deadline for returning materials with payment is printed on the bill.
- All fees are subject to change by action of the Board of Governors.

The University reserves the right to cancel schedules of students who do not pay or have not made arrangements for payment by their billing due date. Students scheduling during late registration period will be charged a late registration fee of \$35.

Tuition and fees may be paid by check, electronic check (e-check), money order, or cash. Credit card payments are accepted through the University's Web-based QuikPay system (with a fee assessed for the service). Refer to the Bursar's Web page for payment instructions.

Refunds

Refunds are not automatic, and course or school withdrawal requires written notification to the Office of Graduate Studies. The amount of the refund depends on the date written notice of the withdrawal is recorded. In order to receive a 100% refund, a student must withdraw prior to or on the first day for each session. See refund schedule that follows.

Housing Fees

The housing fee for students living in North Campus residence halls is \$3,642 per semester and covers double room (\$2,424) and board (14-meal plan, \$1,218). Students residing on North Campus must choose the 14, 12, 9, or 7 meal plan plus \$250 flex dollars. The basic fee for a South Campus double occupancy is \$2,816 and students have their choice of meal plans. Fees are subject to change without notice.

Uncollectible Check Policy

A fee of \$25 is charged for any check returned to the University for any reason.

Refund Policy – Fall 2012

Students wanting to withdraw completely from the University must submit that request in writing to the Office of Graduate Studies and Extended Education. A 100% refund is issued if the course is dropped or withdrawn through the sixth calendar day of the semester. After that, tuition and fees are refunded according to the schedule below. These percentages apply to the total tuition bill, not to partial payments of tuition.

3rd week of the semester 60% tuition and general fees
4th week of the semester 50% tuition and general fees

EARLY AND MIDDLE GRADES EDUCATION

Enhancing Collegiality: Supervision and Mentoring Skills for Cooperating Teachers

EDE591 21 (3 credits) CL#2225

June 25 – 29, 8 a.m. – 4 p.m.

This course allows participants to develop the knowledge and skills necessary to become effective cooperating teachers. The class will examine and explore techniques that aid in the teachers' professional development.

Workshop in Humanizing Teaching and Learning: School Bullying – The Problem, Intervention, and Prevention

EDE589 31 (3 credits) CL#2596

July 9 – 13, 8 a.m. – 4 p.m.

The course provides an overview of the national and international problem of bullying in schools. It explores the following questions: Why is bullying an important concern for teachers? How do we define bullying, what are the typical characteristics of bullies and victims, and what is the range of possible bullying behaviors? What can teachers and administrators do to alleviate bullying and its consequences? Through readings, discussions, in-class learning activities, videos, and guest speaker presentations, participants will better understand bullying, school violence, and ways

educators can act to safeguard all students. The class will also examine recent media coverage, cyber bullying, related Web sites and organizations, and literature, including children's literature. The course contains a counseling component and explores the issue of emotion and behavior management.

Curriculum Integration with the Global Perspective

EDE589 41 (3 credits) CL#1022

August 2, 3, 6, 7, 8, 9 a.m. – 4 p.m.

This active, hands-on workshop is designed for people who are interested in integrating a global perspective in their own teaching and/or in their school curriculum, as well as developing their personal global awareness in today's interdependent world.

HEALTH

Special Topics: Contemporary Culture, Media, and Health

HEA435/581 20 (3 credits) CL#1902

May 15 – June 28, Tuesday and Thursday, 5:15 – 8:45 p.m.

This course is open to all majors and nonmajors on both the undergraduate and graduate levels. It will investigate how contemporary culture and media affects human health. The course will focus on contemporary culture across industrialized nations, as well as various cultures within the United States. The course will emphasize the effects of media on psychological, physiological, social, and emotional health. A variety of media channels will be studied, including entertainment (television, movies, music, video games), advertising (billboards, commercials, radio advertisements), and information (Internet, news programs, newspapers, e-mail, magazines). This course will also include the effects of media on medical self-care and will encourage students to analyze how media impacts their own health.

Special Topics: Violence Prevention – Creating Healthy Safe Environments

HEA435/581 22 (3 credits) CL#2179

May 26 – June 6, Monday and Wednesday, 4:15 – 10 p.m.

This course is designed to assist undergraduate/graduate students interested in examining this major public health issue. Since violence accounts for numerous health problems, this class will differentiate between intentional and unintentional injuries; discuss societal and personal factors that contribute to violence in American society; explore the factors that contribute to homicide, domestic and school violence, sexual victimization, and other intentional violent acts; and discuss strategies to prevent injuries and reduce the risk of occurrence. Students will analyze case studies and identify resources/programs that work to

address violence in settings such as schools, communities, families, and the workplace.

Special Topics: Health Counseling and Health Promotion

HEA435/581 30 (3 credits) CL#1702

July 18, 19, 23, 24, 25, 9 a.m. – 5 p.m.

This course provides students with an overview of health counseling theory and practice in health promotion programs and settings, with specific applications to common health problems. The theoretical framework for practicing health promotion/counseling is based on Ivey's Microskills model, a psycho-educational approach that breaks counseling into discrete skills that can be mastered and applied easily. The class will explore how to facilitate small groups in a public health setting, as well as the structure and function of small-group work. Those planning to work with individuals and/or groups in health promotion practice will find this course beneficial.

Special Topics: Strategic Leadership in Health Care

HEA581 21 (3 credits) CL#2171

June 4 – 27, Monday and Wednesday, 4:15 – 9:15 p.m.

The healthcare industry requires visionary, creative, and transformational leaders who can navigate effectively through a dynamic and complex landscape. This course will provide the foundational concepts and principles necessary for exercising strategic leadership. It will enable participants to develop proficiency in assessing leadership skills, understanding organizational culture, and building effective teams. Additionally, key topics such as visioning, strategic communication, planning, leadership for change, relationship management, negotiation, and conflict resolution will be addressed. Professionalism and ethical conduct, a service orientation, and a commitment to lifelong learning with continuous self and organizational improvement will be emphasized. Discussions will include how to check for environmental trends and changes, address multicultural client needs, and ensure quality services for all. The course will follow a seminar format with mini presentations, discussions, and individual and group activity. All participants are expected to be actively engaged in the learning process.

Special Topics: Advanced Biostatistical Methods

HEA581 31 (3 credits) CL#2827

July 2 – August 2, Monday and Wednesday, 4:15 – 8:45 p.m.

This course allows students to evaluate health-related research questions by completing an epidemiologic study and producing a draft manuscript. Statistical methods to be

covered include multiple linear regression, logistic regression, survival analysis, and the study of a commonly used program evaluation design (i.e., pretest-posttest comparison/control group design). The purpose of this course is (1) to apply epidemiologic and biostatistical skills for designing and analyzing epidemiologic studies and program designs, (2) to gain skills by working effectively with others as team members, and (3) to gain skills by presenting study results orally and in writing. During the course, students will write a brief manuscript that will include introduction, methods, results, and discussion sections. All analyses will be conducted with SPSS syntax. PREREQ: "B" or better in HEA526 (Biostatistics in Public Health).

Special Topics: Adolescent Health Issues – Challenges and Opportunities

HEA581 33 (3 credits) CL#2829

July 11, 12, 13, 16, 17, 8 a.m. – 5 p.m.

Adolescence is a period for personal-ity development and experimentation that might include health-related risk behaviors. The course provides a fundamental overview of adolescent development with a subsequent examination of adolescent health-risk behaviors that result in major public health issues such as intentional and unintentional injuries, sexually transmitted infections including HIV, alcohol and other substance abuse, mental health conditions, distorted body image, and other concerns. The class will examine the prevalence and trends of various health conditions, along with their underlying causes. Emphasizing an evidence-based approach, this course will highlight policies, programs, and services for adolescents, as well as the role of prevention in addressing these health issues. All participants are expected to be actively involved in the learning process.

LITERACY

Creating Readers and Writers in Technology-Infused Classrooms

EDR598 31 (3 credits) CL#2818

July 23 – 27, 1 – 7 p.m. (hybrid class with 15 hours required online)

This hands-on workshop allows pre-K through 12 teachers to develop engaging literacy instruction that is mediated by emerging technologies. Teachers will use theories of literacy development and technology to create innovative learning opportunities for their students, ready for immediate implementation into their classrooms.

MUSIC

Special Subjects: Acronyms and Acoustics – Taking the Mystery Out of Special Education Terminology and Instruction in Music Education

MUE679 34 (1 credit) CL#2836

June 30, 8 a.m. – 4 p.m.

In this course, music teachers will tackle the

fundamentals of special education, master an understanding of their legal responsibilities in the special education process, define instructional methods for special-needs populations, develop collaboration skills in working with special education professionals, and develop a communication plan for parents as partners. Music teachers will develop an action plan for universal accommodations and design to start the first week of school.

Jazz Workshop

AIM679 31 (3 credits) CL#1892

July 16 – 20, 8 a.m. – 4:30 p.m.

Students will study the pedagogy of jazz performance, the importance of jazz history, jazz ensemble performance, and instructional techniques.

Alexander Technique

AIM679 35 (3 credits) CL#1920

July 2 – August 2, Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday, 4 – 7 p.m.

Musicians in particular will benefit from a course of study in Alexander Technique by enhancing their self-image with a primary method that reduces stress. The class covers F.M. Alexander's effective way of decreasing performance anxiety and restoring the most natural coordination of balance – standing, sitting, and moving – for many years to come. The Alexander Technique aims to renew suppleness and lightness by introducing daily activities that are safe, useful body movement principles and by avoiding repetitive motion injuries (RSI); when these methods are used together with an instrument, outstanding results often occur. The class is taught by a certified Alexander Technique teacher. For more information, see bedford-alexander.com/.

Brass Repair

AIM679 36 (2 credits) CL#2247

June 25 – 28, 8 a.m. – 3:30 p.m.

This is an intensive course on basic brass repair and maintenance. Techniques will be demonstrated and reinforced with participants having the option of working on their own equipment.

AIM680 31 (3 credits) CL#2860

PROFESSIONAL AND SECONDARY EDUCATION

Developing Effective School-based Interventions for the ADHD Child

EDF599 43 (3 credits) CL#1042

August 6 – 10, 8 a.m. – 4 p.m.

Over the past decade, ADHD has become the most widely studied childhood disorder. Disagreements over diagnosis and interventions have created confusion over the way teachers and counselors should approach management of this disorder. The intent of this workshop is to provide a comprehensive model for intervention based on recent research, as well as clinical and school-based experience. Research-identified symptoms of the disorder, considerations for intervening with families, issues of co-morbidity, and core principles for effective school-based interventions will be presented.

Teaching with Interactive Whiteboard

EDF599 42 (3 credits) CL#1007

August 6 – 10, 8 a.m. – 5 p.m.

This workshop is for teachers, at all levels of computer knowledge, who are interested in learning how to use interactive whiteboard in the classroom. Participants will create lesson plans for interactive sessions using a whiteboard and will "teach" them to those in the class. The workshop will help participants master whiteboard intricacies, make them aware of resources that are available regarding its use, and help them understand how to manage its technology.

Preparing Standards-based Integrated Units

EDS599 42 (3 credits) CL#1281

August 13 – 17, 8 a.m. – 5 p.m.

This intensive course allows practicing teachers (K-12) to prepare standards-based integrated units. Students will explore a variety of curriculum integration models, select an appropriate one, and create a unit. Students will examine state, district, and disciplinary standards. Units will have performance-based authentic assessments and show adaptations to meet the needs of diverse learners. The course allows individuals or teams of teachers to create or revise curriculum to meet current needs.

Google for Educators

EDS599 41 (3 credits) CL#1012

August 13 – 17, 8 a.m. – 4 p.m.

Students, teachers, and staff can accomplish tasks and share ideas more effectively and quickly when they use Google applications and services. With Google applications there's

no hardware or software to install or buy. Everything is delivered through a standard Web browser – anytime, from anyplace. This workshop is appropriate for all K-12 teachers and will cover Google Advanced Search, Google Earth, iGoogle, Google Talk, Google Notebook, Google Docs, Google Groups, and Google Sites.

iPad and Mobile Pedagogy

EDS599 43 (3 credits) CL#1294

August 6 – 10, 8 a.m. – 4 p.m.

The Apple iPad is changing the educational landscape. Students can make movies, music, and photographs. Teachers can put together professional-looking documents, presentations, and spreadsheets no matter where they are. And that's just the beginning. This hands-on workshop is designed for an existing iPad user who wants to move beyond basic

applications. Participants will realize the potential impact iPad can have on teaching and learning.

SPECIAL EDUCATION

Urban Schools and Culturally Linguistically Diverse (CLD) Students with Special Needs

EDA592 21 (3 credits) CL#2244

June 20, 21, 22, 25, 26, 8 a.m. – 4 p.m.

This course examines special educational reform policies and practices within the context of larger societal issues, with an emphasis on both the stated and unstated goals of reforms such as IDEA (2004), NCLB (2001), Race to the Top (2009), and the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (2010), as well as their intended and unintended consequences. School and curricular reform policy is often

borne out of general concerns regarding the conditions of education in urban settings and the quality of the education for poor students and students of color. An often-overlooked category of students under IDEA and NCLB are those with “special needs” who come from CLD backgrounds and attend “high-needs” urban schools. The course examines social, political, and historical characteristics of urban students eligible for services under IDEA, as well as their families and communities, with an emphasis on the diversity within and across CLD students’ backgrounds. Additionally, this course seeks to construct relevant pedagogy and practices that can engage these students and their families to increase academic achievement and performance, as well as enhance family/school collaboration.
