

Internships Abroad

Studying and interning abroad remain among the most positive, challenging, and rewarding experiences college students engage in. It is important to research the programs you want to participate in and consult your academic department/faculty adviser as well as the International Programs office located in 101 Old Library if you have any questions. This list is a great start, but there are many other possibilities – so talk to your adviser about your options!

American InterContinental University (AIU)

AIU provides an opportunity for students in a variety of majors to participate in an internship while in London, England. Placements are based on academic experience and future career goals. Students have the option to participate in either a full time (six credits) or part time internship (3 credits). However both internships require attendance at a weekly class and part time interns also sign up for two other classes.

Athena Study Abroad

This program offers two programs that combine taking classes and participating in an internship into one semester. The two locations are London, England and Dublin, Ireland. Students can visit either location and take classes related to their academic goal. In London, an internship coordinator will help with placements, setting up interviews and appointments as well as providing supervision throughout the program. Dublin offers internships through Irish and multinational business organizations. Internships can be arranged in a number of different academic majors.

AustraLearn

AustraLearn provides numerous programs for students wishing to go to Australia or New Zealand. The Professional Development for Academic Credit (PDAC) Internship is a 10 week program where students can receive six academic credits through Chapman University in almost every major. These internships allow students to receive a “high quality professional” experience and are offered four times a year. However if students can not participate in the PDAC Internships, there is still an opportunity to obtain an internship abroad. Students wishing to participate in an independent internship are responsible for arranging credits with their home institution.

BCA Study Abroad

The programs offered through BCA also offer internships however these internships are going to vary depending on where the students want to study. Internships can be completed for credit or not for credit. Once the student arrives at the study centers in their chosen location, the BCA resident director will help find a placement for the student. However please note that they cannot guarantee a placement every semester.

The Center for Cross-Cultural Study

This program is for students who wish to travel to Seville, Spain and are studying the Spanish language and aspire to teach. Each summer a practicum is offered starting with a 4-credit language and culture course, followed by an internship as a teacher's assistant for 5 weeks. As a teacher's assistant, the student is providing students with instructions in English and teaching about the culture of the United States. Topics covered include arts and crafts, technology, games, and other themed activities.

Some programs offered through this agency do have the option of participating in an internship as well as taking classes. There is at least one available internship opportunity for every continent with the exception of Antarctica. This agency will work with you to find the academic courses and internship that is right for you.

Center for International Studies (CIS)

CIS offers three summer internships. The locations are in England, Ireland or Spain. Internships in London require that the student be receiving credit for participating in an internship from their home institution. The programs in Spain require students to participate in a two week language class before beginning their internship. Each program is able to work with the students to find an internship that relates to the student's academic major and country of choice.

It is the goal of IEP to promote study abroad experiences to students in order to expose them to other countries, languages and cultures. A student would receive credit through Jacksonville University which could then be transferred to back to the student's home

institution. IEP offers internships in a variety of locations around the world. They will customize a program to the specific student and include housing, travel insurance, airport pickup, onsite orientation, and support services.

Institute For Study Abroad (IFSA) Butler University

Butler University offers study abroad programs in which students can obtain an internship while taking classes. Internship opportunities can be applied to a number of different majors and count as academic credit once completed. All internships are unpaid. Students can visit Australia, England, Ireland and Scotland and have the opportunity to add an international internship to their resume. If students are interested in visiting Latin America or Spain, they have the opportunity to participate in volunteer programs which do not count towards academic credit.

In addition to taking classes, ISA offers two internship programs for academic credit. The first is in Brussels, Belgium. Brussels is the capital of the European Union and therefore this program is for students interested in business, communication and international affairs. Internships available in Brussels are unpaid and available Fall, Spring and Summer sessions. The second internship spot is London, England. This program is open to students of a variety of majors and there are opportunities where a student can earn up to six credits for an internship.

Temple University, Toyko and Rome Campuses

A student combines classes and an internship to participate in this program. The most common internship option is a three credit program where students work a total of 140 hours (equivalent to 10-20 hours per week). These internships can be paid or unpaid and can last for one or two semesters. For both of these programs it is desirable to be bilingual in either Japanese or Italian and English, however there are placements where the communication in the native language is not required. Once students are accepted into the study abroad program they will receive information detailing internship opportunities available near where they are going to be studying.
