How to Register

Enrollment for West Chester University summer sessions involves scheduling and payment. It can be completed by telephone, mail, or in person within the scheduling and payment deadlines given on pages 1 and 2.

Students may schedule for any or all summer sessions at the same time. The scheduling process is complete only when the University receives payment.

Some courses and workshops do not follow the standard session dates. These are noted in the course listings. Students who register for these courses must do so during the scheduling period for the session in which the course begins.

Course registration does NOT automatically sign you up for housing. For details, see page 3.

Step-by-Step Registration Instructions

1. MyWCU Web portal (WCU students only)

Students may use any computer with access to the World Wide Web, on campus or off. MyWCU is accessed from the WCU home page (www.wcupa.edu).



2. Operator-Assisted Telephone Registration

Call 610-436-3541; choose option 7. This option is available for all students. Please have your course registration information ready when you call.

3. In-Person Registration

Complete the registration form in this booklet and bring it to the Office of the Registrar, 25 University Ave.

If you register in person before the billing deadline for the session, your scheduling form will be processed by the Office of the Registrar, and a bill will be mailed to you. This bill will confirm your registration, indicate where your class will be held, and give the payment due date. **Students who schedule after the billing deadlines must pay when scheduling.**

4. Mail Registration

Academic Information

Late Registration

Students who are not simply adjusting their schedule but are scheduling after the deadlines for each session listed on the previous pages will be charged a \$35 late fee. Late registration takes place at the Office of the Registrar, 25 University Ave., West Chester, PA 19383.

Drop/Add

During the Drop/Add period of each session, a student may drop a course, thereby receiving no grade for the course, by filing a drop/add form in the Office of the Registrar.

Withdrawing from a Course

A grade of "W" will be entered on the academic record of any student who withdraws from a course during the following periods:

First Five-Week Session May 28 – June 12

Second Five-Week Session July 1 – July 17

Post Session August 4 – August 13

After the above dates, students may not withdraw selectively from courses. They may, however, withdraw from the University by contacting the Office of the Registrar. The University will record a "W"

for all courses in which the student is registered.

A student may not receive a “W” during the last two days of classes. If the effective date of official withdrawal is during the last two days of classes, a letter grade will be assigned for all courses in which the student is registered.

Students who stop attending class and fail to drop a course officially can expect to receive a grade of “F” for the course.

A full refund will be issued if the student withdraws either prior to or on the first day of the summer session. Refer to the “Fees and Expenses” section for the complete refund policy and procedure.

Summer Graduation

Students who expect to graduate in August at the end of summer session should contact their major department. August graduates may participate in the May commencement exercises if they file their notice of intention to graduate online. Please reference the list of graduation dates and deadlines at wcupa.edu/registrar/grad_app_timeline.html. If you have not already applied online for graduation, you must apply in person at the Office of the Registrar.

University Regulations and Policies

The same regulations for student procedure and conduct that are in effect during the academic year are also in effect during summer sessions. Academic policies can be found in the Undergraduate Catalog. The Student Code of Conduct can be found in the *Ram’s Eye View*.

Access Your Grades Electronically

Grade reports **will not** be automatically mailed. If you need an official copy of your semester’s grades for tuition reimbursement, fill out a request form at the Office of the Registrar. You can print a copy of your grades from myWCU.

Summer School Overload Policy

The maximum student load for summer sessions is seven hours for each of the Five-Week Sessions and three hours for the Post Session. Written permission for exceptions to these loads must be obtained from the chairperson of the student’s major department. Bring this permission to the Office of the Registrar.

A student should not seek permission to carry an overload if his or her cumulative grade point average is below 2.75.

Important Notes

- The times, days, and location of classes are subject to change.
- Each summer session offering is contingent on adequate enrollment in the course, as determined by the University administration.
- This course schedule is not to be regarded as an irrevocable contract between the student and West Chester University.
- Admission to a summer session does not imply admission for the academic year.
- Students may have someone else register for them with written permission from the student who is being registered.

General Information

About the University

West Chester University’s 402-acre campus provides students with modern classrooms and laboratories, an excellent library, and comfortable residence halls. The University is within walking

distance of downtown West Chester and public transportation into Philadelphia, which is approximately 25 miles east of the campus.

During the regular academic year, West Chester University enrolls more than 10,000 students in its undergraduate programs and 2,000 students in graduate programs. Students may pursue baccalaureate and master’s degrees as well as enroll in a number of certification and other nondegree programs.

Housing

Housing on North Campus is available to summer students during the session(s) they are registered for classes. The summer residence halls are conveniently located near both Lawrence Center, which houses the dining hall, post office, and many support offices, and Sykes Student Union, which houses the bookstore, food court, and student services offices. Summer housing applications are also available on the department’s Web site at www.wcupa.edu/_service/stu.lif/. Both online and in-person applications will be available beginning Monday, March 9, 2009.

For full consideration, applications should be received by May 1 for the First Five-Week Session and June 1 for the Second Five-Week Session. Summer residents must be on the meal plan during their stay in the residence hall. Any changes or cancellations to housing applications must be received in writing to the Office of Residence Life and Housing Services no later than three days prior to the start of the session. Rules and regulations as outlined in the current edition of the Guide to Residential Living and in effect during the regular academic year will also apply to summer.

Parking

Student parking spaces/lots do not require a parking permit during summer sessions. Faculty and staff parking spaces/lots require a current faculty and staff parking permit between the hours of 7 a.m. and 4 p.m.

Student Services

Summer students at West Chester University have available the same full range of services provided during the academic year.

- The **Twardowski Career Development Center**, which provides career planning and placement services, is on the second floor of the Lawrence Center, Room 229. For more information, call 610-436-2501.
- The **Children’s Center** provides care for children (ages 3–11) during class time for First and Second Five-Week Sessions. Summer hours are based on enrollments and space availability. Further information is available in McCarthy Hall or by calling 610-436-2388.
- The **Counseling Center**, staffed by licensed psychologists, offers individual counseling for personal problem solving as well as vocational counseling and testing on a confidential basis. Students may come to the second floor of Lawrence Center or call 610-436-2301.

- **Financial Aid** is available to summer students in the form of work-study employment, student loans, and student grants. Students may come to Room 030, 25 University Ave., or call 610-436-2627.
- The **University Health Center** provides first-aid and routine treatment of minor illnesses. Located in Wayne Hall, second floor, the office is open during the summer Monday through Friday from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. Summer students may take advantage of a group accident and health policy, approved by the University, which covers them for the 12 weeks of summer sessions. Call the University Health Center, 610-436-2509, for information.
- **Recreation and Leisure Programs** provides organized recreational activities for summer students and offers use of recreational equipment. On-campus activities include intramural basketball, softball, and beach volleyball. Campus facilities include gym, pool, tennis courts, beach volleyball, and indoor and outdoor tracks. The Outdoor Adventure program rents camping equipment for a nominal fee. The Sykes Fitness Center is free for all registered students. For those students not registered for the summer but returning in the fall, there is a \$25 per session usage fee. For schedules and times, or for recreational information, call 610-436-2133.

- The deadline for returning materials with payment is printed on the bill.

Students scheduling during the late registration periods (First Five-Week Session, May 26 and 27; Second Five-Week Session, June 29 and 30; Third Session, August 3) will be charged a late registration fee of \$35.

This mandatory instructional fee will be used to enhance classroom technology.

Students enrolled in multiple summer sessions will be charged no more than the equivalent of the full-time semester rate.

Late Registration Fee

A \$35 late fee is charged to all students who fail to schedule or pay prior to the appropriate deadline. The relevant deadlines are listed on the preceding pages.

Dishonored Check Fee

A fee of \$25 is charged to accounts if a check is returned for any reason.

Late Payment Fee

Students who fail to pay or submit their semester bills by their due date will be assessed a late payment fee. Nonreceipt of a bill does not relieve students of the responsibility of paying or submitting their bill by the due date. For those paying by mail, please allow sufficient time for payment to reach the University by the due date. Financial aid students who fail to confirm their attendance by the due date, even if no payment is due, will also be liable for this fee.

Refunds

All refund requests must be made in writing during the appropriate session. Contact the Office of the Registrar, 25 University Ave.

Housing and meal refunds are calculated on a pro-rated basis and require an official check-out from the residence halls or apartments.

A full refund will be issued if the student withdraws prior to the start of the summer session or on the first day of the summer session. Once the session begins, the following schedule applies:
