2012 Spring Social Skill Groups at SPARC

...more than just a play group!

SPARC treats each child as an individual. In developing each social skill group, a Board Certified Behavior Analyst reviews current IEP objectives and a separate questionnaire via parents to determine 4-6 objectives to be targeted. Based on each child's needs, skills may be taught in a 1:1 setting, with a peer, or in a small group setting (3-5 peers). Peers may or may not be on the spectrum. SPARC has a state-of-the-art computerized data collection system in which your individual child's data will be recorded. Individual consultation with parents will be provided every 2-3 weeks to discuss progress and generalization procedures. At the conclusion of the session a summary report will be provided to parents that includes progress, data and next steps.

Scheduling: After a review of the IEP and The Assessment of Social and Communication Skills, your child will be scheduled for a one hour class each week. Classes are held on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday afternoons between the hours of 4:00 and 6:30 and are organized according to age and skill level.

Enrollment: 13weeks – Week of January 30 through Week of May 4
NO classes: Week of March 12

Cost: \$975 + \$50 intake fee (for new clients)
\$780 (re-enrolling Social Skills clients)

The rate includes: goal development, data analysis, and individual parent consultation.

Registration due by: January 20, 2012

Offer to New Clients: As part of the intake fee new clients receive a 30 minute consultation with Cherie Fishbaugh, BCBA, Senior Consultant and Director of SPARC's Social Skills Program.
