

Waste and Recycling

WCU WASTE & RECYCLING FACTS

- 1. West Chester University contracts with <u>Republic</u> Services for waste and recyclables pickup.
- 2. WCU has a single-stream recycling system, meaning that paper, glass, cardboard, and plastic and metal containers all go into one bin.
- 3. Contamination of recycling bins with non-recyclables, food, or liquids can result in the entire contents being trashed. We want to avoid that!
- 4. Waste is disposed of at the <u>Lanchester Landfill</u>, managed by the Chester County Solid Waste Authority. Lanchester captures, compresses, filters and dries methane gas and uses it to generate electricity.
- 5. Recyclables are taken to Republic Service's King of Prussia Materials Recovery Facility (MRF).
- 6. WCU has several types of Waste and Recycling bins on campus.
- WCU Custodial Services is gradually introducing the mini-bin trash and recycling system to all campus buildings.



OFFICE CHECKLIST OF TO-DOS

	We post information about acceptable recyclable materials prominently in our workspace (see For More Info below for link)
	We encourage staff to minimize the use of paper by distributing documents digitally and printing double-sided
	We encourage the use of Multi-Function Printers rather than individual desktop printers
	When available, we purchase supplies made with recycled content
	We ensure that toner cartridges and retired electronics (including monitors, printers, keyboards, computer mice, cables, etc.) are recycled $\frac{1}{2} \left(\frac{1}{2} + 1$
	We work with Facilities to donate surplus furniture for re-use on campus
	We add our surplus office supplies to the $\underline{\text{Surplus Office Supplies List}}$ instead of throwing them out
	We encourage our team to share personal unwanted items on the $\underline{\text{WCU Yard Sale}}_{\underline{\text{Facebook group}}}$
	We discourage vendors from sending printed or physical promotional materials
	We select "swag" for events only after considering the environmental and social justice costs of products $ \frac{1}{2} \left(\frac{1}{2} \right) = \frac{1}{2} \left(\frac{1}{2} \right) \left$
	We review proper recycling practices at staff meetings or by email to increase awareness and reduce confusion
	We do not use single serving coffee brewers, or if so, we use reusable filters to avoid single-use plastics $$
	We use rechargeable batteries to reduce the need for one-time use batteries
	Our building administrator communicates with custodial staff to ensure we are following waste and recycling guidelines
	We have found a creative solution to waste reduction not listed here and have informed the Green Office Team $$
	We work with outside partners to recycle widely used items not acceptable through WCU's single-stream system (e.g., Terracycle)
