Alicia Hahn and Libby Thorsen	 Alicia presented the history of the Women's Center. Libby presented the services provided by the Women's Center – education, confidential resource/space for women in crisis, advocacy of policy In the Fall of 2015, the center reached 1693 students. Alicia and Libby presented the center's 5-year plan. They have a diverse group of 8 undergraduate and 2 graduate students working for them. 	
	 4. They are working on having diverse groups such as men and transgender students feel safe to come to them. 5. They have a 2-year violence prevention program, including bystander intervention, engaging men, student/staff training, public awareness/social media/marketing, programming on healthy sexuality, analyzing policy ad reporting practices, and campus climate. Libby spoke about some specific programs, such as healthy masculinity and campus-wide Green-dot violence prevention. 	
	Q: What is the ratio of men to women attending the Green-Dot program?A: They definitely have more women than men, but they have started to partner with fraternities.Each fraternity sends 2 students to their programs.Q: Do we still have child care for students with children?A: no	
	6. Partnerships: Faculty can request to have them come into the classroom, offer their programs as extra credit, collaborate on class projects, add a statement of support on the syllabus, submit a proposal for the Women's Leadership Conference, or serve as speaker for the Women's Center or the violence prevention program	
Lynn Klingensmith (Director of Social Equity) and Hiram Martinez	 Lynn is also Title IX and ADA Coordinator. Introduced Assistant Director – emphasis on coordinating diversity initiatives – Hiram Martinez Hiram introduced himself and talked about his background. Students have come in to ask Hiram for help in advocating for issues that are important to them. Hiram emphasized that he cannot effectively work with students without the support of faculty. 	
Advising Task Force Cheryl Wanko	 Cheryl showed a tool rolled out by the task force. Online advising notes capability – it is on the student's WCU page. There is also a series of tutorials for faculty and students for questions on advising. On the 'My advisees" page, there is a new column on the right, that includes advising notes. Cheryl handed out some suggested do's and don'ts for notes. 	
	Q: College of Ed, some faculty have 50 advisees, with a 15-minute meeting for each. Faculty are having a hard time putting all the info back into the advising notes.A: The system will time you out so perhaps type notes on Word and then just cut and paste later. Another suggestion is to keep a post-it note per student and write notes for each, then just go back and fill out advising notes.	
	 Q: Is it only faculty who have access to this? In Languages and Cultures, students can test out of courses. How do we access someone else's notes? A: Cheryl said you can access the DPR to access other students. Q: How do we make sure things like this do not increase faculty workload? 	
	A: It's best practice so it would be advisable to use it. However, we currently do not have an evaluation process for advising. There is also an issue of equity in advising load. There is a proposal that may indirectly help with loads, but we can't move forward because of budget issues. CBA says advising is faculty work, with exceptions listed. Departments are hiring program counselors, but this	

	is not consistently and systematically done across campus.	
	Q: Is there a space where students can write notes? They need to take responsibility for their	
	courses and tasks they have to do.	
	A: No, but you can have students type it out while they are with you.	
Research committee	1. Acknowledged members – David Bolton, Erin Hill, Bill Sawyer, Anne Krulikowski, Israel Sanz-Sanchez	
report – Israel Sanz- Sanchez	2. The motivation for the committee is the realization that as we continue to grow, research and scholarly activities are becoming very important. In order to be effective teachers, we have to incorporate research into our teaching.	
	3. Israel presented the document they drafted. It has a general position statement, then a listing of issues that have had a negative effect on faculty research, followed by a list of initiatives the university can do to support research.	
	4. David said "research" is not in the mission and values statement of the university. Bill explained that literature shows research is an important part of undergraduate pedagogy.	
	5. The document might have to be communicated with APSCUF, since workloads and the CBA are mentioned. The teacher-scholar model should be taken out because it goes into workload expectations. Ellie suggested we take this draft and consult with APSCUF before taking it to the administration.	
	6. Q: #4 – "vast differences among colleges" – there should be more clarity on these differences and how different types of scholarship are valued, e.g., research with students, research in applied fields, research that brings in funding, etc.	
	7. Need clarity on guidelines for research in graduate programs, including doctoral programs.	
	8. Israel will incorporate suggestions into document, and forward to APSCUF for comments.	
Senate business	1. Jim summarized events surrounding Provost appointment. In November, Senate came up with a position letter on this issue, sent to President Weisenstein. He proposed to draft a document creating an appraisal process. Then the administration came out with a letter that stated Senate supported the appraisal process. Several faculty were upset about how the Senate was characterized by the administration.	
	2. There is a lack of clarity on processes for hiring administrative positions. It might be useful to have a discussion on this during the March meeting to clarify what our rights and limits are.

Committee Reports

Research ad-hoc committee: Chair: Israel Sanz-Sanchez Members:

- Original issue that got the ball rolling with this ad-hoc committee in 2014-2015: WCU institutional mission should it be modified to mention research?
- Access to internal funds (faculty in CAS and, to a lesser extent, other colleges have experience significant delays in the processing of payments, which makes it difficult to complete research projects in a timely manner).
- Expectations for research are increasing in many colleges and departments, but teaching loads are remaining the same (or even worse, since many departments have eliminated discretionary AWA). Related issue: how is the 25% expectation for temporary faculty affecting AWA availability and overall conditions for research?
- Different levels of support for research across disciplines: e.g., Business and Public Affairs gives one yearly AWA, but this level of support is not homogeneous in other units.
- Teaching/research identity at WCU: are we a teaching-only institution? If not, what is the connection between teaching and research? Is research only valid for us at WCU if it is directly connected to teaching?
- Next Senate meeting on 10/22: Visit by the President and Mark Rimple. We will start working towards a more articulated vision, but by that meeting we will have perhaps one or two questions for them in connection to faculty research.
