<p>Faculty Senate Mission Overview and Accomplishments and Involvements from AY2013-14</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Mission of Faculty Senate <ul style="list-style-type: none"> -The mission of the Faculty Senate at West Chester University is to ensure classroom and non-classroom faculty involvement in the shared governance of the institution. A forum for advocating and evaluating institutional policy and related matters affecting the welfare of the University, the Faculty Senate is committed to fostering a climate that promotes the growth and development of faculty and students. • Senate Bill 1275 <ul style="list-style-type: none"> -The Senate facilitated a number of discussions regarding the bill with administration and faculty/staff and advocated for additional faculty input in the decision-making process at various stages (i.e., creation of the feasibility study methods and implementation of the study, etc.). -To date, the bill appears halted (i.e., not moving out of committee). • Sexual Misconduct Policy <ul style="list-style-type: none"> -Title IX mandates faculty/staff to report names of anyone involved in sexual misconduct situation to Office of Social Equity Title IX Coordinator (i.e., Director of Office of Social Equity). -Faculty Senate authored a resolution supporting anonymous reporting and facilitated discussions on Title IX policy changes and subsequent dissemination/publicity of changes with Office of Social Equity and SGA. -To date, health care workers at wellness center, psychologists at counseling center, and clergy now have an approved exception to Title IX. Contact the Director of Social Equity for specific concerns. -For more sexual misconduct procedural information, please go to the WCU Social Equity website at: http://www.wcupa.edu/Admin/Social.Equity/sexualMisconduct/default.asp • Weapons Policy <ul style="list-style-type: none"> -In AY2013-14, Faculty Senate authored resolution and provided advocacy on this issue. -Chancellor reported that the policy stays as is, i.e., WCU will continue to have a 'no weapons' policy. • Institutional Culture of Research <ul style="list-style-type: none"> -Sanz-Sanchez led discussion on the institutional culture of research at WCU including review of WCU overall inclusion of research in mission statement, change in research/scholarship job requirements, institutional challenges, and research support services. Discussion included two presentations by Gautam Pillay, Associate VP Research of the Office of Sponsored Research (OSR). -For more information on research services and supports, go to the OSR website at: http://www.wcupa.edu/research/ 	
<p>Open Faculty Senate Positions</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Election to fill open Executive Committee Vice President position: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> -Due to accepting an administrative position, Marc Gagne's Vice President position on the Executive Board is open. Election held for open Vice President spot and Jim Brenner was the election winner. • Two Senate seats open: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> -College of Education (CoE) Representative – CoE election to fill seat -At large Senator seat – Per Faculty Senate constitution, person with next largest amount of votes in last APSCUF election is offered the seat. Hence, James Scythes was offered and accepted. 	
<p>President G. Weisenstein</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Budget: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> -Council of Trustees (CoT) passed projected budget on 9/25. WCU may have to use some reserves to balance budget but depends on performance funding. Currently, WCU has 17% state appropriation. -PASSHE held grant competition for institutions that lost money; WCU applied for transition grant and was awarded 1.2 million to backfill the loss of 1.6 million – mitigated losses -To further mitigate losses, goal is to increase revenue via branch campuses, co-located programs, and distance education. • Senate Bill 1275: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> -The bill did not get out of committee and will most likely not be reintroduced. Chancellor is legitimately attempting to address concerns. There is now a focus on culture and how the state system can help make each institution as successful as possible. 	

• **Trends in Student Body Growth:**

- Number of 1st time undergraduate students was slightly less than last year; number of graduate students increased
- Currently, in the process of creating co-located programs with Delaware and Montgomery County Colleges to accommodate transfer students (NOTE: highest percentage of transfer students are from Delaware CC followed by Montgomery CC.)

• **Co-Located Programs:**

- WCU in process of creating co-located programs with regional community colleges to accommodate transfer students.

• **Philadelphia Campus:**

- 175 students at Philadelphia campus
- Talks in place about adding more programs at the Philadelphia campus

• **Branch campus:**

- The planning process has commenced with PDE in order to start a branch campus in the Fort Washington area.
- The planning committee will be going through application and approval processes in the future and will also have discussions on campus.
- Current faculty will not be forced to teach at branch campuses.

• **Distance Education:**

- Support services for distance education have grown
- Faculty expressed concern over the distance education SRIS. Norms still being compiled for the distance education SRIS. A minimum of 50% of students need to respond to SRIS for results to be included in TeP materials. The distance education SRIS continues to remain voluntary for students to complete.

• **Parking constraints:**

- Faculty reported a parking constraint concern. Zoning issues do not permit the moving of WCU service vehicles in lots in West Goshen Township
- Administration is encouraging alternative transportation, using South Campus parking and shuttle to North campus. Currently, there is shuttle service from Exton Septa stop.
- APSCUF and President to potentially discuss hike in parking permit fee or tiering fees dependent on location in order to raise funds for more parking; however, all 6 unions would need to agree at changes.

• **Construction Issues:**

- The Department of General Services (DGS) is an overlay agency which slows the construction process.

• **College of Health Sciences (CHS) Expansion:**

- CHS growing highlighting the need for the South Campus expansion.
- The options include: (1) renovation of Sturzebecker (which will occur in all options), (2) annex to Sturzebecker, (3) move athletics to another building (like U of Delaware's building).
- Administration is currently working with East Bradford, East Goshen, and Westtown Township supervisors.

• **Safety of Intersections:**

- There is a potential plan to make intersection at Rosedale and High Streets safer which will include buy-in from multiple partners.

• **International Efforts:**

- WCU has partnerships with Norway, China and Russia. Other agreements include India, continental Europe, Africa, Costa Rica and Guatemala. WCU has 6-7 agreements total.
- International partnerships not only increase international student revenue but also prepares our students to work in the global marketplace.

• **Overview of Senate Liaison to Cabinet Role (Brown)**

- Faculty Senate Exec has regular meetings with the President and Provost, but now has an informal Senate Liaison to Cabinet which is intended to permit accountability and transparency.

*DeHope and Brown also informally meeting with two members of the CoT to improve communication; can make it a formal committee in future

* Concerns over Philadelphia site and branch campus – also climate issues for the Philadelphia campus, a new branch campus, Graduate Center, and distance education

+Philadelphia Branch Campus:

- Breaking even at the Philadelphia site (Millhous)
- Duplication of programs requirement is no longer an issue with this branch campus
- Issues include:
 - *students not receiving the same resources as main campus
 - *new faculty – concerns include mentoring, access to services, etc.

* Tuition by Credit: To increase revenue, charge tuition by credit has been proposed. Representatives from Faculty Senate and APSCUF on the committee.
