# Internship and Co-operative Education Opportunities

The department has an active internship program that allows you to earn up to 12 college credits for part-time or full-time employment with area businesses. Six of these credits can be applied towards the 120-hour accounting degree and the remainder can be applied towards the educational requirements to become a Certified Public Accountant (see Additional Requirement below).

## **Undergraduate Degree**

**Bachelor of Science in Accounting**. Students can earn this degree through day or evening classes, upon the completion of 120 credit hours.

# Additional Requirement

Although 120 hours are needed to earn a B.S. in accounting, the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania licensing board requires the completion of 150 credit hours to become a Certified Public Accountant, which is similar to most state licensing boards. The additional 30 credit hours can be taken at the undergraduate or graduate level. The department offers advising guides for students who wish to complete 120 hours in four years or 150 hours in five years, which is recommended. (However, the 150-hour program can be completed in four years.) The 150-hour guide includes an option to obtain a dual major in accounting and finance.

With a rich heritage dating back to the 19th century, West Chester University was founded in 1871 as West Chester Normal School for the purpose of training teachers for the Commonwealth's newly established public schools. In 1983, West Chester State College became one of the 14 institutions in the State System of Higher Education. Along with its university status, the school acquired a new system of governance and the opportunity to expand its degree programs.

Today, more than 15,400 graduate and undergraduate students, along with 1,500 faculty and staff, study and work on the 406-acre campus. Situated in the Borough of West Chester, the campus is a picturesque mix of Gothic, Victorian, and modern architecture with pleasant, tree-shaded walks.

Strategically located at the center of the mid-Atlantic corridor between New York City and Washington, D.C., West Chester is just 25 miles west of Philadelphia and 17 miles north of Wilmington.
