Why transfer to WCU?

West Chester University is a public, regional comprehensive institution founded in 1871 and located 25 miles west of Philadelphia in West Chester, PA. It is the largest institution in the 14-member Pennsylvania State System and is the fourth largest university in the Philadelphia region. WCU is consistently placed by US News & World Report in the Top Public Schools (North) and Regional Universities (North) rankings.

WCU offers more than 118 undergraduate degrees, 101 Master's and 2 doctorate degree programs organized into five Colleges and one School: Arts and Humanities, Health Sciences, Business and Public Management, Sciences and Mathematics, Education and Social Work, and the School of Interdisciplinary and Graduate Studies – a full list of undergraduate programs can be found on the following website: http://www.wcupa.edu/academics/programs/

West Chester University is committed to comprehensive internationalization with a focus on providing opportunities for students to achieve global literacy, international education, and cultural exchange. West Chester University's Center for International Programs (CIP) is the designated office on campus to provide special assistance, advising and programming for the members of the WCU international community.

Undergraduate Admission Requirements:

- Minimum GPA: 2.0 (some majors may have higher entry requirements)
- No minimum number of credits to transfer, though students with fewer than 24 college-level credits will be asked to supply a credential evaluation of high school qualifications
- \bullet TOEFL (iBT) score of 80 or overall IELTS band 6.0 required to satisfy English language requirements
 - TOEFL/IELTS requirement waived if 30 college-level credits have been completed at a US institution to include satisfactory grades in Composition I and II.
- Rolling admissions, but it is recommended that Spring semester applications are submitted by 1 November, and Fall semester applications by 1 May.

Scholarship opportunities: Provost's Scholarship for Global

Diversity and Academic Achievement: a limited number of these competitive \$4000 awards are available, renewable for one more year based upon academic merit

- o **Requirement 1**: Successful admission to WCU
- **Requirement 2**: Student must be on an F-1 visa transferring to WCU
- **Requirement 3**: Overall 3.0 GPA from the transfer institution

Transportation Information for Commuter Students: Parking on-campus is available to commuting students with a permit. In addition, there is also an Exton Train Station shuttle bus service which runs numerous times a day. SEPTA Bus 104 also has a stop on campus.

Extracurricular Opportunities: There are over 300 clubs and organizations to include 24 NCAA Division II athletic teams, 20 club sports, and 10 intramural sports. Service learning is also a vital part of the WCU experience, with over 812,000 hours of community service logged by students last year.
