

Film Criticism Minor: Advising Sheet

Students complete the Film Criticism Minor by taking one required course—FLM 200: Introduction to Film—and five electives, for a total of six courses (18 credits) in all. An interdisciplinary program housed in the English Department but comprising courses from several different departments on campus, the minor is flexible and allows you to specialize in your own area of interest. In addition to enriching your knowledge of film, the program offers skills and opportunities relevant to a wide range of career paths.
