DESCRIPTION:

■ Students will earn up to 6 pass/fail transfer credits at WCU in either German 201, 202 or at a higher level depending on the students placement in German. Students will receive 80 hrs of instruction from Actilingua (a language school in Vienna) and another 10 hrs of mandatory instruction from Dr. Moser during excursions in Vienna and Munich, Germany, Budapest, Hungary, Salzburg, Austria and Bratislava, Slovakia, and Prague, Czechia. Excursions include: Walking tours of Vienna, Munich, Salzburg, Budapest, Bratislava, and Prague with Dr. Moser; Tours with Dr. Moser at the Military History Museum; Belvedere Palace Österreichische Galerie and many more. Students may come to Europe before the program starts and/or stay longer on their own too.
