Student Achievement

The BUEP program aims to prepare students to succeed in entry-level positions in planning and planning-related disciplines. Students in the program will gain the planning-related knowledge, skills, and values, supported by a strong liberal arts education, necessary to assume leadership roles to help communities foster sustainable, equitable, and healthy places. Student achievement is measured with a variety of methods, including a formal learning assessment, exit survey, and the quality of studio and other work products.

The program values high-impact, experiential learning opportunities for all its students, including internships, applied and commissioned research, conference attendance, and study abroad. The program has a goal of having 75% of students complete internships and at least 50% of students to complete a high-impact learning experience such as an applied research project, as study abroad experience, or attending a state or national planning conference. Of the 20 students who earned degrees in the 2021-2022 and 2022-2023 academic years, nearly 70% completed internships, and nearly 50% had an opportunity to attend a Pennsylvania Planning Association annual conference.
