Step 1 – MEET WITH YOUR ADVISOR: Meet with your advisor to share your interest in the program. Step 5 – GAIN GRADUATE STATUS: If you confirm that you are continuing your studies after completing the B.S.Ed., you will matriculate as a graduate student and be eligible for graduate aid, assistantships, and other graduate student benefits.
