USING AN IPAD AS A DOCUMENT CAMERA

A document camera allows teachers to display various media including documents, books, and three-dimensional objects like manipulatives. You can use your iPad with an iPad stand and one of the apps below to present a live demonstration to your class either in-person or virtually.

EQUIPMENT

- iPad
- iPad Stand available from the Tech Center

SHARING YOUR IPAD SCREEN VIA SOLSTICE

- Download the <u>Solstice Mersive App</u> > Launch the app > Choose the Ramcast room and enter the onscreen key.
- Drag down the top right-hand corner on the iPad screen > select the screen mirroring icon \Box .
- Select the Ramcast room again and enter the same on-screen key.
- To stop sharing, drag down the right-hand corner on the iPad screen > select the screen mirroring icon > hit Stop Mirroring. Don't forget to Disconnect from Ramcast too.

SHARING YOUR IPAD SCREEN VIA HDMI

- Equipment: Lightning to HDMI adaptor available to borrow from the Tech Center.
- Insert the adaptor into the iPad > Plug in the HDMI cable from your projector.

PRO TIP

• Pro Tip #1: Before sharing your screen, open Control Center and enable Do Not Disturb to prevent incoming alerts from being shared.

APPS TO USE FOR PRESENTING LIVE DEMOS

- **Document Camera App:** Place your iPad on an iPad stand with the screen facing up. Open the Document Camera App and begin.
- Whiteboard Apps: Try the built-in Zoom Whiteboard, Explain Everything, or Google Jamboard. All these
 apps feature an interactive whiteboard and screen capture capability. *IPEVO Whiteboard app has an
 additional feature that allows the user to annotate and draw directly on the camera feed.
- **PowerPoint App:** Use the PowerPoint app to annotate or draw on slides during presentations. Share your iPad screen in Presenter Mode and use the top toolbar to draw on slides.
