1. Restrictive Major Requirement (RMR): To remain in the major or to transfer into the major, the student must complete the following prerequisite courses with a GPA of at least a 3.0 and a minimum grade of "C" or better; CSD 101, CSD 106, WRT 1XX, MAT 103 or above, CSD 203, CSD 207, ENG230/LIN230, and WRT 2XX. Students may not use more than a total of three repeats across the CSD courses to satisfy the RMR (CSD 101, CSD 106, CSD 203, and CSD 207).

- 2. Letter Grade Requirement: Grades of C-, D, or F earned in major (CSD) courses must be raised to C or better. A major course in which a student earns a grade of C-, D, or F must be repeated the next time the course is offered (provided space availability exists). If a student earns less than a C in a major course that is a prerequisite for a more advanced course, the student will not be permitted to enroll in the advanced one until the prerequisite course is repeated with a grade of C or better.
- 3. GPA Requirement: A minimum 2.5 cumulative GPA and 2.5 GPA in the major courses are required for all communication sciences and disorders majors to complete the degree program.
- 4. Related (Cognate) Area courses 1, 2, 4, 5, and 6 can be taken during any semester. (The numbers assigned to Related Areas courses in the above course sequence were used simply to ensure that each course was accounted for).
- 5. Students must take PSY 100 as one of the behavioral and social science courses to meet the standard of the American Speech-Language Hearing Association (ASHA).
- 6. Students must take (1) BIO and (2) CHE or PHY as the science courses to meet the standard of the ASHA.
