

Committee for Excellence in Learning and Teaching (CELT)

The mission of the Committee for Excellence in Learning and Teaching (CELT) includes fostering collaborations among faculty and with students to build a scholarly community around issues of teaching and learning. With members from all areas of faculty and administration, CELT's goals are to enhance curricula and instructional modes to actively engage learners in connecting theoretical and applied knowledge and improve the quality of their learning. Programs sponsored by CELT include Book Discussion Groups, Spring and Summer Workshops, and CELT Development Funds for teaching projects (funding up to \$2000.)

Athletic Advisory Board

The Athletics Advisory Board serves as a review and advisory body to the President of West Chester University. The Board will work closely with the Vice President for Student Affairs and the Director of Athletics assisting with the development of University's Athletics Program. It is made up of 7 faculty members, 6 administrators and three students.

The Board is chaired by the NCAA Faculty Athletics Representative (FAR). The FAR's responsibilities include overseeing the well-being of student-athletes and acting as a liaison between academics and athletics.

The Office of Service Learning and Volunteer Programs

The Office of Service-Learning and Volunteer Programs assists faculty with integrating community engaged learning opportunities into their teaching and research. The Office works directly with more than 100 local community agencies. Departments that use service-learning in their courses cut across all five colleges. Resources offered to faculty include class presentations about the benefits of service-learning, sample syllabi, publication information, syllabi assistance, teaching materials, and assistance with creating collaborative partnerships with community agencies. WCU defines academic service-learning as a teaching method that combines community service with curricular goals as it focuses on critical, reflective thinking, and civic responsibility. Service-learning courses involve students in organized community service projects that address community needs, while developing their academic skills, sense of civic responsibility, and commitment to the community. West Chester University is a member of the PA Campus Compact and is proud to be awarded the President's Higher Education Community Service Honor Roll. The Faculty Mentoring Program (FMP)

The mission of the Faculty Mentoring Program (FMP) is to enhance lifelong professional development in teaching, scholarship, and service. The mentoring relationships will support collegiality, effective communication, self-evaluation, and cultural competence, all of which enhance a stimulating and supportive university environment.

The FMP is open to all full-time Academic and Administrative faculty as defined by the most recent CBA. Faculty in all the university colleges and organizations (Arts and Science, Business and Public Affairs, Education, Health Sciences, Visual and Performing Arts, and Non-Classroom Faculty) are eligible to participate as mentees and to serve as mentors. The program includes a one-time orientation session in the fall term and regular monthly meetings of mentoring pairs throughout the rest of the academic year.

The Sustainability Advisory Council

In 2010 WCU became a signatory to the American College and University Presidents Climate Commitment, joining more than 600 institutions in expressing our deep concern about global warming and our commitment to educate students for a sustainable future. The university has made sustainability one of the five pillars of its strategic plan, created an Office of Sustainability, and adopted an ambitious Climate Action Plan that challenges us to make sustainability and climate change part of the educational experience of all WCU students. WCU's Sustainability Advisory Council (SAC) welcomes the participation of new faculty members as we continue to offer sustainability-related curricular and pedagogical workshops for faculty from all colleges and disciplines. In addition to sustainability in curriculum and research, SAC members support sustainability initiatives in transportation, energy consumption, waste and recycling, dining services, campus grounds, and more. The university-wide SAC is made up of faculty, students, and staff who are excited to guide and support WCU's sustainability efforts. Office of Research and Sponsored Programs

We provide guidance and resources to faculty, staff, and students who are developing proposals for research, scholarly and creative activities that are internally and/or externally supported. We also support the development of other externally sponsored administrative programs. We provide information on funding opportunities from federal, state, and private-sector sponsors. We coordinate all pre-award activities, external proposal submissions, and the intellectual property development process. We collaborate with Finance and Business Services and other offices responsible for post-award management to ensure that grant-funded activities are implemented effectively and that Principal Investigators are knowledgeable of mandatory policies and procedures. We formulate and execute research-related policies and strategic plans for WCU.

Office of Distance Education

Office of Distance Education is a centralized office that supports the development, promotion, implementation, and assessment of distance education programs and courses at West Chester University. The office works closely with deans, department chairs, and faculty to expand existing distance education programs as well as identify and develop new programs. The office provides comprehensive services to support distance education faculty and students to offer high-quality distance education courses and ensure student success.

Center for International Programs

The CIP strives to provide cohesiveness and direction for all international programming at West Chester University. A unit within the Office of the Provost and Vice President for Academic Affairs, our objectives focus on WCU's comprehensive-internationalization initiatives for the campus and include:

- working with faculty and departments to develop academic exchange and faculty-led study abroad programs
- facilitate international travel processes for faculty and the university.
- managing WCU's agreements with international institutions
- immigration and orientation services for international students and visiting scholars
- global awareness activities through cultural and educational activities throughout the year to create a campus-wide global perspective

The Career Development Center

The mission of the Career Development Center is to educate and engage students from first year to alumni as active participants in their career development, implementing a holistic approach to support the purposeful pursuit of their academic and professional goals. We assist with individual career planning, career exploration and serve as a central location for employers to connect with WCU students. Advising Task Force
